

KINGS STADIUM

Field Usage Rules and Regulations

1. You must have authorization from the Athletic Office in order to use the field.
2. Only turf tires will be used on the field (air-filled tires). No plastic tires or hard rubber tires are permitted.
3. Props used in band contests or events must not have anything on them which may cut into the surface of the field.
4. Cleats for field must be molded or screw-ins as approved by the OHSAA and the National Federation of High Schools. Track spikes must be ¼" or less. (Random checks will be applied to ensure this regulation is followed.)
5. No large vehicles of any type will be permitted on the field.
6. Anything involving "fire" MUST be kept out of the stadium (fireworks, sparklers, cigarettes, etc.).
7. Items which are absolutely prohibited on the field:
 - a. Chewing gum
 - b. Sunflower seeds
 - c. Sticky candy – gummi bears, Swedish fish, Starburst, taffy, etc.
 - d. Food and beverages (other than water for the teams)
 - e. Glass bottles
 - f. Tobacco products
8. No animals at any time are permitted on the field.
9. Athletes crossing the track to get to the turf field should use the black mats that are rolled across to protect the track surface.
10. No equipment (Gator, Twister, etc.) will be parked stationary on the field.
11. Avoid doing the same activity in the exact same location on the field for extended periods of time (e.g. if running a cone zig-zag drill, move the cones periodically).
12. Make sure that all lights in locker rooms and press box as well as field lights and the score board are turned off before leaving the facility.
13. Make sure that all locker rooms, restrooms, concession stands, press box and gates are locked before leaving the facility.
14. Transmitting sound or playing music via the press box or a stereo system is not permitted before 10:00 am.
15. Playing music at a disturbingly loud volume is prohibited at all times.
16. **NOTE:** Organization/Team that secures use of facility will be responsible for all costs and repairs if damage or violations occur during organizations use.
