

**Kings Local School District
Process for Gifted Identification in Visual Arts**

Step 1: An educator, parent, or student may submit a referral form requesting an evaluation for visual/performing arts assessment **(PAGE 2)**. Please refer to the district's deadlines for fall and spring testing.

Step 2: The parent or guardian gives permission for the evaluation process **(PAGE 3)**.

~SUBMIT DOCUMENTS FROM STEP #1 AND STEP #2 TO YOUR CHILD'S BUILDING PRINCIPAL~

Step 3: The student collects at least five works of art for evaluation. All artwork must have been completed within the last 24 months of submittal. **SEE PAGE 4 FOR SUGGESTIONS!!**

Step 4: The student completes one written response sheet for each art work submitted. The written response sheets must be in the student's words. **(WRITTEN RESPONSE SHEETS ARE ON PAGE 5)**

Additional information:

The student may submit his/her portfolio to his/her art teacher before the portfolio is due, in order to obtain feedback before presenting the final portfolio.

The final portfolio must be submitted to the art teacher at your child's school in the first school week of March. A team of art teachers will evaluate the portfolio and you will receive a letter informing you of the results of the assessment.

Teachers will be evaluating the portfolios during the months of April (for Jr. High and High School) and during the month of May (for elementary)

If your child is identified as gifted in visual/performing arts, his/her teacher will be informed and may use this information to help provide appropriate educational experiences for your child. At this time, there are not separate classes for students identified as gifted in visual/performing arts. Ohio has a mandate to identify gifted students, but there is no mandate or funding to provide service for visual/performing arts.

Display of Work

All work must have been completed within 24 months of the evaluation.

MAY INCLUDE:

1. Drawings or paintings that were created in class.
2. Outside artwork that has been submitted to the art specialist.
3. Photographs of 3-dimensional work (e.g. sculptures)
4. A written historical or critical review of an artwork that includes a copy of the work reviewed (limited to one entry).
5. Artistic photographs
6. Original fashion/costume designs or completed pieces.
7. Original architectural drawings of student-designed structures.



ALL WORK MUST BE MOUNTED OR MATTED IN ART QUALITY FORMAT. IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO HAVE WORK FRAMED.

IS NOT:

1. A class project that is reproduced by all students (such as a color wheel).
2. Pre-drawn pages from published materials.
3. Color copies of work.
4. Any collection of works with **fewer than five items accompanied by Artwork Written Response Sheets (on the following page).**

Tips for choosing and writing about your artwork:

Choose Art that:

1. Has been completed within 24 months of the evaluation
2. Is original (not copied from books, comics and other sources; especially not cartoon characters unless you have made them up yourself).
3. Displays a wide variety of art materials (pencil, crayon, chalk, pastel, paint, colored pencils, clay, etc.).
4. Includes a background.
5. Shows different or unusual ways of using art materials.
6. Shows greater detail.

The Display of Work Portfolio must be accompanied by a completed Artwork Written Response Sheet for each art piece.

On your response sheet include:

1. Full sentences;
2. art terms;
3. clear explanations of the meaning of the art work;
4. your strengths and weaknesses in technique or skill
