<b>Academic Quiz Team</b>	The Academic Quiz team (AQT) is a FAVC league sponsored team. The AQT plays a league schedule versus eight other FAVC schools. The FAVC league tournament culminates the season with the winner given a berth in the State of Ohio AQT tournament. The format of the matches consists of four rounds with different academic categories such as American literature, world history, math and physical science. A league match consists of two varsity and one junior varsity match. Match questions are answered both in teams and individually with a buzzer system. <b>Color Guard</b>	The Kings High School Color Guard is a section in the award winning Marching Band. The color guard is responsible for portraying visually the music the wind and percussionists are playing. They do this by dancing and with the use of equipment including flags, rifles and sabers. The guard performs with the marching band at all competitions, football games, parades and any other performances. Auditions are held in May. All color guard members are required to attend all summer practices if they are not on vacation. There is also a <u>mandatory</u> 2-week band camp to attend in July. Rehearsals are held every Monday and Wednesday evenings during school. Football games are Friday nights. Competitions are on the weekends.
