### Columbia Intermediate Named OAESA 2015 Hall of Fame School

The Ohio Association of Elementary School Administrators announced that Columbia Intermediate School has been selected as a 2015 Hall of Fame School. Principal Shelly Detmer-Bogaert was recognized and presented with a certificate at Tuesday night's board of education meeting by Mark Jones, Associate Executive Director of the OAESA.

The Hall of Fame School award recognizes schools that go above and beyond the call of duty to get students, teachers, and community members excited about education. The staff submitted an extensive application documenting the quality of their educational program in the following areas: instructional system, student achievement, student development, personnel, administration, school management, and stakeholders.

Hall of Fame Schools were chosen by two committees of OAESA members; one of which read and scored the applications and the other which conducted on-site evaluations of qualifying schools. Committee members wrote that, "Columbia Intermediate employees went above and beyond to provide a wonderful, caring, supportive learning environment in sync with their mission of approaching all decisions through the lenses of 'Climate, Curriculum, and Community'."

Mrs. Detmer-Bogaert and her staff will be formally presented with the award, including \$1,000 to be used at the principal's discretion. OAESA will recognize ten winners of the Hall of Fame Award during an Awards Luncheon to be held June 12, 2015, at the Hilton Columbus at Easton.





## Kings Local Schools Earn Auditor of State Award

A recent financial audit of the Kings Local School District by the Auditor of State's office has returned a clean audit report. The Kings Local School District's excellent record keeping has earned it the Auditor of State Award.

The Auditor of State Award is presented to local governments and school districts upon the completion of a financial audit. To receive the award, entities must meet the criteria of a "clean" audit report such as filing on time, an audit that does not contain any findings for recovery, material citations, material weaknesses, significant deficiencies, Single Audit findings or questioned costs.

The Auditor of State's office is responsible for auditing more than 5,800 state and local government agencies. Under the direction of Auditor Yost, the office also provides financial services to local governments, investigates and prevents fraud in public agencies and promotes transparency in government.

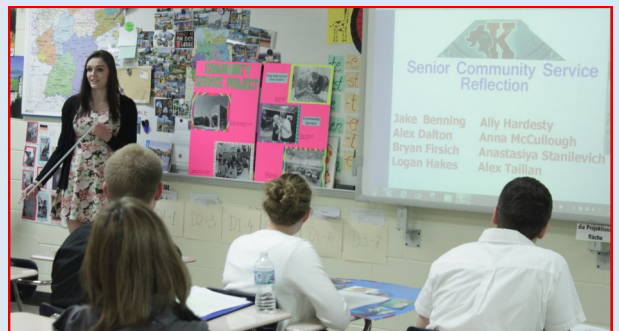


## Senior Reflection Night

*A significant amount of funds generated by this levy supports technology and maintenance programs in the Kings Local School District. Losing this levy would require redirection of operating funds to complete necessary repairs.*

*What is a permanent improvement levy? "Permanent Improvement" means all money collected will be spent on property, assets, or improvements with an estimated life or usefulness of five years or more.*

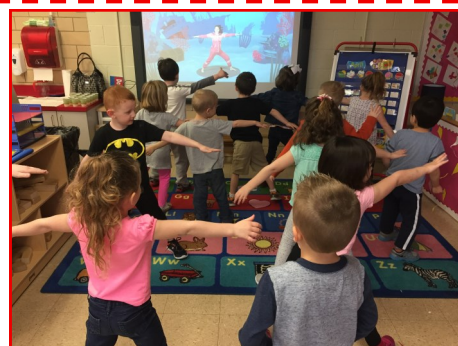
## Surprise Reader at KME

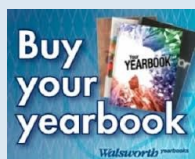

## CIS Slice of Life Blogging Challenge

Fifth and sixth graders in Holly Mueller's Columbia Intermediate English Language Arts classes participated in the March Slice of Life Classroom Blogging Challenge sponsored by [www.twowritingteachers.wordpress.com](http://www.twowritingteachers.wordpress.com). Mueller's students have been publishing 250 word blog posts weekly on topics of their choice since October, using Kidblog.org. Starting March 1st, they were challenged to post a slice and comment on three other slices daily, all 31 days, even throughout spring break. Students could choose their level of participation, with rewards for each level. Since the blog was taken public, technology discussions were held about creating digital footprints and the importance of kindness, encouragement, safety, and responsibility when posting and commenting. Over a third of the students reached Level 5, the top level, posting and commenting every day in March. Upon returning from spring break, students reflected over the experience, reporting that it improved their writing skills and confidence and fostered a sense of community. 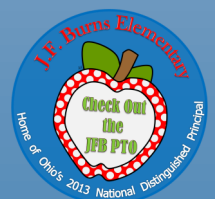
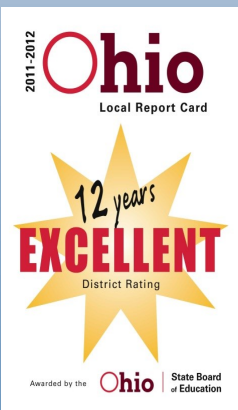
