

KHS Highly Ranked, AGAIN!

Kings High School has again been named among the best high schools in the nation! This week, U.S. News & World Report released their Best High Schools Rankings for 2014. KHS ranked



#666 out of more than 19,400 high schools in the nation, giving them the distinction of being in the top 3% in the country.

The rankings and data offer the most comprehensive information available on public high schools in the U.S. To produce the rankings, U.S. News worked with a research organization and their methodology reflects how well high schools serve all of their students, not just those who are planning to go to college.

KHS Principal Doug Mader said, "Making the list of the top 3% by U.S. News & World Report shows evidence that rigor, relevance, and relationships are in existence at Kings High School. Anyone who walks the halls of KHS can see the respect for high achievement that the students and staff strive for on a daily basis. The community should be very proud of what our students and staff do here. These achievements are truly a team effort." This ranking makes Kings High School the number one high school in Warren County and ranks KHS in the top ten among other greater Cincinnati high schools, as well as #31 in the state of Ohio.

KHS Engineering Students Invent Tray Stacker

The students in Jason Shields Engineering 2 class at KHS have invented another product to help the district save money. Students eating hot lunch in all Kings buildings receive their food on a Styrofoam tray. With help of Kings Business Manager Steve Waldmann, the students worked on a plan to decrease the amount of wasted space in a trash bag caused by the trays.

The students did a quick calculation of the volume reduction by putting 100 trays in at a random fashion into a trash bag. Once crushed down, the students realized that it was an 88% reduc-



tion in trash! They went to work on creating a prototype and after trial and error, have created 18 tray stackers, 3 for each of our 6 school buildings, that will be used in each of our buildings beginning next school year. Their hope was to eliminate 1 dumpster per school building and save the Kings School District \$15,000 per year. Great job!
