Kings Staff Attend Mental Health Workshop



Representatives from the Warren County Educational Service Center were in the district this week to teach a course called Youth Mental Health First Aid. Warren County ESC is one of three ESC's in Ohio (including Wood and Cuyahoga) that will be part of a major national initiative to support teachers, schools, and communities in recognizing and responding to mental health concerns among youth.

The educational agencies—including school districts in 28 different states and departments of education in 20 states—were awarded Project AWARE (Advancing Wellness and Resilience in Education) grants from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to (among other activities) train teachers, school staff, and other community members in Mental Health First Aid.

Mental Health First Aid is an 8-hour course that teaches people to identify the signs of mental illnesses and addictions, how to provide initial help, and how to connect individuals in crisis with appropriate care. Since 2008, more

than 250,000 individuals in the U.S. have completed the Mental Health First Aid course.

Your insurance will be billed directly for the service, therefore please make sure that UC Health is an "in network" provider with your insurance carrier. You will need to bring your insurance card and a photo ID with you on your scheduled appointment day. The results of your examination will be reported directly to you and to the physician you designate and will not be reported to the Kings Local School District or any of its personnel.

Kindergarten Registration for the 2015-16 school year is 4:00-7:00 p.m. Thursday, April 9th, at the Kings Junior High School Multipurpose Room, located at 5620 Columbia Road. Your child must turn 5-years old on or before Sept. 30, 2015, in order to register.

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, the Kings Local School District will offer "Young 5 Kindergarten." This half-day program will allow students to overcome achievement gaps that may occur at young ages; as we blend play based activities to meet the academic and developmental needs. The program will be available for children who will turn 5 between July 1st and September 30th. Children who attend the "Young 5 Kindergarten" program will be required to attend full day Kindergarten the following year. This program is tailored for children that are chronologically young and typically have not had a preschool experience. If parents would like to have their child attend a 1/2 day program and then attend full day kindergarten the following year and the child turns 5 before July 1, a 5 year old preschool would be their option.

cones. Club Adviser Juli Elder said, "This is a fun activity we do every year with the kids! We hang some right here around SLE and the kids get to take them home as well."



Questions and Answers From Kings Kloset

Q: How does the Kings Kloset work?

A: The Kings Kloset accepts donations of new and gently-used clothing on the days they are open for shopping. The Kloset is run by volunteers – students and a few parents – so receiving and giving out clothes on the same day makes it easier to manage. The clothes are inspected to make sure they are clean and fairly current with today's styles. Items are sorted by size, gender and season. Current styles are added to the store's inventory asap. Apparel



that is off-season is stored until the appropriate time of year. In the late summer, a big drive to collect donations of school supplies takes place; donations can be brought to schedule pick-up at all of the schools.

Q: Who can shop at the Kloset?

A: The clients who shop the store are Kings' students and families who are on a tight budget, with little money to clothe their family. They really appreciate these donations and are thrilled to be able to wear clothes that look like those of their classmates and friends. When the store is open, Kings' families are allowed to select up to ten pieces of clothing for each member of their family. Guidance counselors and teachers also have the option to bring students in to shop at the Kloset at their discretion.

Q: Where is the Kloset?

A: The Kings Kloset is located in the Kings Education Center building, the KEC, at 1797 King Avenue, across from Kings Mills Elementary school.

Q: When is it open?

A:The Kloset is open the first Saturday of February, March, and May from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m., and the second Saturday in April (because of Spring Break). That means the next time it's open is NEXT Saturday, February 7th. Keep the Kloset in mind if you have clothes your kids have outgrown, if you know of someone who could benefit from shopping at the Kloset or if you, yourself, want to come. This is Kings at its best: neighbor helping neighbor.
