KHS Students Take the Pledge to "Don't Text and Drive"

The students at Kings High School were given the opportunity to take a pledge not to text and drive last week. A "Don't Text and Drive" campaign banner was donated to the high school and students signed the banner and took a pledge not to drive distracted. The students were given a black wristband to wear that says, "DNT TXT N DRV" as a constant reminder of the pledge that they have taken.

The campaign was organized by Warren County Safe Communities Coalition (WCSCC), Joey Brumfield, Trauma Outreach Coordinator with Atrium Medical Center, along with the Warren County Sheriff's Office, AAA, the Ohio State High-

way Patrol, and several other local police departments and traffic safety partners throughout Warren County. The coalition presented the banner to Kings High School Student Council President Katie Gould and Vice-President Matthew Fowler, and the Kings community at halftime of last Friday night's basketball game against Loveland. The banner will be displayed in the high school as a reminder to student drivers to not text and drive. Some of the

SLE Learns About Raptors

RAPTOR, INC. is a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation of birds of prey through rehabilitation, education, and conservation. They educate the public on the importance of raptors and the preservation of their native habitat. Last week at South Lebanon Elementary, Cindy Alverson, an educator with RAPTOR, discussed the basic physical traits and characteristics of these birds and the many ways that kids can be active participants in promoting safe environments for them. RAPTOR has a limited number of captive birds that can not be returned to the wild due to the extent of their injuries. These birds are used in



over 250 RAPTOR programs given annually to schools, scout troops, churches, and senior citizen groups.






Project Excellence - Excellence in Teaching Educator Award Nomination




Looking for Distinguished Alumni

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
