### Kings Has a STATE CHAMPION!

Congratulations to Kings Swimmer Sophomore Megan Sichterman! She is the Ohio High School Division I 2015 **State Champion** in the 100 Butterfly, with a winning time of 54.35. Megan's time is the 4th all-time fastest in the history of the OHSAA State Swim Meet!



She also finished 8th in the 500 free with a time of 4:58.18. She joined the 200 Freestyle Relay team with Tara Fears, Corinne Baber and Shannon Jelley and earned 12th place. Megan was also a member of our 400 free relay that finished 17th.

Congratulations to ALL of our state meet swimmers: Senior Tara Fears (20th in the 100 fly, 12th 200 free relay, 17th 400 free relay), Freshman Corinne Baber (12th in the 200 free relay), Freshman Ally Carlin (17th in the 400 free relay), and Freshman Shannon Jelley (17th in 100 fly, 17th in 500 free, 12th in the 200 free relay, and 17th in the 400 free relay.).

Overall, as a team, the Lady Aqua Knights finished 15th out of 55 teams that scored points at the state meet.

## Kings Junior Wins Rotary Speech Contest

Congratulations to Kings Junior Mackenzie Mettey who won the Mason-Deerfield Rotary Four-Way Speech Contest this week.

The Four-Way Test Speech Contest, sponsored by Rotary International, is held annually for interested high school students at local and district levels. The speech is presented from memory without the aid of a podium, notes, displays or props, and lasts between four and six minutes. Contestants apply the Four-Way Test which asks the following four things: Is it the TRUTH?, Is it Fair to all concerned, Will it build GOOD WILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS, and Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Each year, two students from Kings High School and two from Mason High School participate in the Mason-Deerfield Rotary contest. This year Mackenzie was joined by Nicholas Froehlich to represent Kings.

Mackenzie and Nick presented their speeches in front of Rotary Members and Guests. Mackenzie will compete at the district level at Wright State University on Sunday, March 30, against winners of the individual clubs.

There are 29 Rotary Clubs in Rotary District 6670 (basically southwestern Ohio). Each of the clubs in Rotary District 6670 holds its local contest in Feb/March, and local winners compete in the District 6670 Competition.

Rotary International is a world-wide organization dedicated to serving others. Great emphasis is placed on using one's vocation, not only to serve others, but to establish honesty and integrity as marks of one's profession and involvement in the world of work. The Four-Way Test has a long tradition of use around the world and is a part of Rotary's motto: Service Above Self.

## Congratulations to Kings Dance Team– ECC Champs!

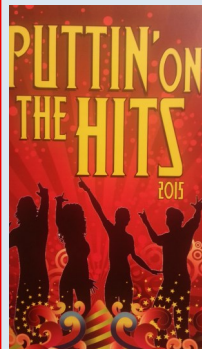

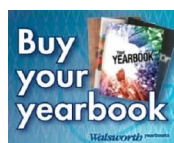


## KME's Extravaganza Coming SOON!

## Rock Sundaes?

Last week, the third graders in Mrs. Elder's Class at South Lebanon Elementary finished up their Rocks and Soils Unit by learning how to create their very own sedimentary rock sundae. The students used real life materials like gravel, sand, crushed seashells and a grout mixture, to replicate the creation of sedimentary rock layers in nature. They even had the opportunity to add their favorite seashell as the 'cherry on top' of their sundae! Mrs. Elder said, "This was a fun investigation as we were able to tie in the many marine fossils found in our area due to the Ordovician period of history, where we used to be an ocean."

## Preschoolers Learning About Dinosaurs

Mr. Dan from the Cincinnati Museum Center visited the Kings Pre-school Integrated Classrooms to teach the students about dinosaurs. The students learned about different types of dinosaurs, explored fossils of teeth, claws, a T-Rex jaw bone, and even dinosaur droppings! ### KHS Student in Shakespeare Competition

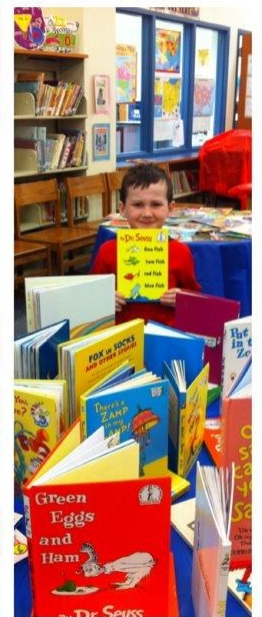
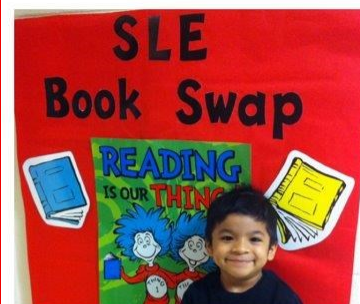

Kindergarten Registration for the 2015-16 school year is 4:00-7:00 p.m. Thursday, April 9th, at the Kings Junior High School Multipurpose Room, located at 5620 Columbia Road. Your child must turn 5-years old on or before Sept. 30, 2015, in order to register.

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, the Kings Local School District will offer "Young 5 Kindergarten." This half-day program will allow students to overcome achievement gaps that may occur at young ages; as we blend play based activities to meet the academic and developmental needs. The program will be available for children who will turn 5 between July 1st and September 30th. Children who attend the "Young 5 Kindergarten" program will be required to attend full day Kindergarten the following year. This program is tailored for children that are chronologically young and typically have not had a preschool experience. If parents would like to have their child attend a 1/2 day program and then attend full day kindergarten the following year and the child turns 5 **before** July 1, a 5 year old pre-school would be their option. 

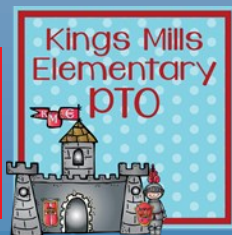
