KHS MRDD Students Participate in Video

Cincinnati ReelAbilities Film Festival celebrates the lives, stories, and art of people who experience disabilities. Reelabilities is the largest national film festival dedicated to celebrating the lives, stories, and art of people with disabilities. Recently, our students in Angie Zlatic and Junior Ili's Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities classroom, took part in making a video organized by the organization Living Arrangements for the Developmentally Disabled (LADD), and ReelAbilities. Junior Grace Ficke and KHS teacher Cassandra Barnes took the time to film the students and create the shots to introduce a film presentation that was made to the entire KHS student body.

KHS teachers Matt Jacobs and Cassandra Barnes brought the Cincinnati ReelAbilities Education Outreach Program presentation to KHS; one of the first area schools to host the Outreach Program, following Sycamore High School's model. The MRDD students spent a few days breaking up the script into parts and rehearsing the lines with their voices or communication devices.

KHS students spent the last hour of the day on Friday, May 1, watching a video produced by ESPN E:60 about a young student faced with challenges and difficulties. After the film, the students discussed the importance of accepting anyone different from themselves.

Studying Seed Germination at SLE

J.F. Burns Dedicates Fountain for Grandma Millie




Alumni Update


