NATIONAL STOP BULLYING MONTH IS OCTOBER

It's National Bullying Prevention Month and the Kings Local School District would like to make you aware of some resources available to you right on our website. We offer a hotline that can be found on the home page

of our website. You just click on the bottom where it says "Stay Safe, Speak UP." Also on the home page, down in the middle of the page, there is a box that says "Information for Parents." Click on the "Student Safety" tab. There you will find a Parent Info Center. If you click on the Staff Training box and register your name, you will have access to resources on Child Abuse Prevention and Bullying Prevention. On the block for Student Training, you will find two separate videos on Bullying and one on Steroids and Supplements Use, Abuse, and Prevention Strategies.

We hope that you will take some time to review this information with your child.



Ohio Ebola Update

This week, Kings School District Officials participated in a statewide conference call with the Director of the Ohio Department of Health, Richard Hodges, Governor John Kasich, and State Superintendent Rick Ross for an update on Ohio's Ebola preparedness. Additionally, our school nursing staff participated in a related webscast. The following is what we learned:

- Ebola Is NOT spread through the air or water
- Ebola is spread through direct contact with the blood, body fluids and/or contaminated objects (i.e. needles) of a person who is sick with the illness.
- The Ohio Department of Health recommends all individuals in direct physical contact (i.e. handshake) with an infected person be guarantined for 21 days.
- It is also recommended that individuals not in direct contact, but within a three foot radius of an infected person, take their temperature twice daily and consistently check for symptoms up to 21 days after last contact. Notification and self-monitoring should also be make to individuals within the vicinity of an infected person.
- People are only contagious when they are symptomatic and show signs of a fever.
- Anyone believing that they have been in contact with a person with Ebola should call their health care provider and their local health department.

We will continue to share any new information with you as we receive it.

For more information, the Ohio Department of Health has activated a 24-hour-a-day hotline to answer Ohioans' questions regarding Ebola at 1-866-800-1404. You can also get more information on the ODH website.

KME Force and Motion

Students in Mrs. Tepe and Mrs. Caudell's classes had a lesson in force and motion. The students worked in stations using different toys to observe force and motion. At each station they had to record their observations and answer questions. The stations included using the force of air to blow different sized bubbles, exploring magnets and their properties, used ping pong balls and different sized straws to move their ball and compare which tool was easier, and using toy cars on different surfaces to observe friction and the results it creates on forces.

Learning History Through Play

The students in Frank Wright's Government class at KHS are learning history in a fun new way! Mr. Wright has developed a board game called the Constitution Game, to help students master the Ohio Government Learning Standards. After the new standards were released, the KHS government teachers began to incorporate them into lesson plans. Students play the game by rolling dice and answering questions about




