Kings Board of Education Hires New Interim Superintendent

At Tuesday night's regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting, the Kings Board voted unanimously to hire current Assistant Superintendent, Timothy J. Spinner as Kings' new Interim Superintendent. The latest change in leadership comes from the resignation of Interim Superintendent John Lazares.

Spinner will act as interim superintendent for Kings until July 31, 2015. The Kings Board of Education will begin a Superintendent Search in January or February of 2015 to find a permanent superintendent for the 2015-2016 school year.



Spinner writes:

I am honored to serve our community in the position of interim superintendent. It will continue to allow me the chance to work with all of our staff and students preschool through twelfth grade. As is true with every school year, this is a critical, yet exciting time in our district's history. Your continued support will be vital to seeing us through the many challenges I am confident we will meet and face together.

Thanks in large part to the consistent support from our community as well as the dedication of our staff, the Kings Local School District has accomplished a great deal over the past several school years. We have a lot to be proud of, but there is still much work to be done. I look forward to the opportunity of serving alongside our community, staff and students in this new role as interim superintendent. Are You Prepared for an Emergency?

The Kings Local School District takes Safety and Security very seriously. We continue to develop and review safety plans. The district is now in the process of evaluating the options and processes that will be required for reuniting students with their parents in the event of a major incident in the district. This is a common matter for consideration but one that requires proper planning and preparation for implementation.

A recent Harris Poll conducted on the behalf of Save the Children concerning a disaster preparedness report card noted that 65% of parent respondents said they were at least somewhat concerned about the risk their child faces from natural disasters, and 55% said they were at least somewhat concerned about the risk their child faces from terrorism.

The average parent responding to the survey spent 5 hours organizing back-to-school supplies, but only one hour on family-emergency planning. This being noted, it is a great time for each member of the Kings family to consider your own home safety and security plan. Kings Manager of School Business Affairs, Steve Waldmann has put some tips and resources together for our families to help create a disaster plan for your home.


