

The profile includes additional accountability measures that better define a high-quality education and are not included in the state's report card. The Quality Profile helps characterize the overall educational value of public education beyond standardized testing. The content is based on 9 categories: academics, arts, commitment to improvement, digital learning, fiscal stewardship, parent and commu-



nity involvement, staff leadership, student leadership and activities, and student services.

## 2015 National Merit Commended Scholars



The National Merit Scholarship Program has released their list of Commended Scholars for 2015. Four of those students are Kings High School Seniors! Congratulations to Leah Ball, Jacob Meyer, Samantha Paulson, and Matthew Tracey.

Commended students are named on the basis of a national Selection Index qualifying score, applicable to all participants without regard to state-by-state distribution. A total of 1,419,424 students entered the 2015 National Merit Program by taking the 2013 qualifying test.

## **SLE Second Grade Leaning Scientific Method**

Miss Pagan's second graders at South Lebanon Elementary are learning about Scientific Method. Their latest experiment consisted of watching raisins "dance" in 7Up. 




