

The NAMM Foundation applauds districts and schools who set the bar in offering students access to comprehensive music education.



Every year, two teachers from each Warren County school are chosen for this special award. Community members and staff are encouraged to nominate teachers for these awards. Mrs. King and Mrs. Schumacher will be honored at the 30th annual APC recognition banquet scheduled for May 3 at the Warren County Career Center.

The Area Progress Council – a countywide private business organization – started Pro-

ject Excellence in 1988 as a way to honor and recognize excellent educators. APC solicited funds to create a \$1 million endowment for this recognition program. Since its inception, Project Excellence has honored 624 educators and awarded \$458,800. Honorees are given \$600 for personal use and \$300 for their district for a classroom or district-wide project.

CIS Students Nature Walk

At the end of March, students on Team Positive went on a Nature Walk to Landen Lake as a culminating activity during their Ecosystem unit. One of their key topics had been learning about how symbiotic relationships and organisms interact with each other to survive. Students looked for birds nests which is an example of commensalism, bees and flowers which is an example of mutualism, and other symbiotic relationships. Students also collected chlorophyll, fungi, and seeds to further their discussion of each in the classroom. Lastly, they looked for different types of consumers: herbivores, omnivores, and carnivores.

KHS Senior Reflection Night and KHS Art Show

On Thursday, April 6, Kings High School seniors participated in the annual Community Service Reflection Night, a night where all seniors share with the community how they performed their required community service hours.

The evening began with Senior Ethan Cain being presented with the Mayerson Foundation Book Award by KHS Community Service Adviser, Lynn Brant. Ethan has logged 549 service hours by serving at the Cincinnati Nature Center as a Camp Counselor.

The featured speaker of the evening was Ann Helfrich from Josh Cares. She spoke to the entire senior class and their guests about the non-profit organization that she and her family created after her beloved son, Joshua passed away after suffering a traumatic brain injury at the age of 10.

Her organization supports critically ill children. Their missarrant constant $\ensuremath{\mathsf{I}}$

sion is to provide comfort, support, and companionship to seriously ill children enduring lengthy hospitalizations without a family member who is able to be with them consistently. The organization provides professionally trained Life Specialists to serve as surrogates for the families who would be by their child's sides if they could.

After the program in the auditorium, students gathered in assigned classrooms throughout the building to give a short presentation of how their community service impacted their lives and lives of others. Many students used technology such as videos, movies, or Powerpoint presentations to reflect on their service experiences. The Class of 2017 has a combined service of 21, 102.25 hours and counting!

The Kings High School Art Show was held in the Bradford Media last night, as well. Several pieces of art from our undergrad art students, as well as the Senior Art Show projects were on display throughout the media center. We sure have some talented students at KHS!



The Rain Barrel Project 2016

Students from Kings High School and Kings Junior High School have been selected to paint rain barrels as part of the fifth annual Rain Barrel Art Project, an initiative designed to educate the community about water conservation and pollution caused by storm water runoff.

This year two students from Kings Junior High, Kaleigh Cooke and Michelle Jiang designed a rain barrel inspired by the artwork of Charley Harper. The barrel was painted as collaboration between Kings Junior High and Kings High School students. Jessica Salda'na and Baeli Garner painted in conjunction with Kaleigh Cooke and Michelle Jiang to make the design come to life on the rain barrel.

The Rain Barrel Art Project is a joint effort of SaveLocalWaters.org and the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden. As part of this initiative, students and other community members throughout the Ohio River Valley submitted ar-



tistic designs to beautify otherwise dull rain barrels. About 50 of those designs were selected, and the submitting artists' barrels will be displayed at the Cincinnati Zoo's Go Green Garden through April and auctioned off during the Rain Barrel Art Benefit Auction on April 20, 2017.

The project, hosted by the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden, is a joint effort to educate the community about water conservation and pollution caused by storm water runoff. Does Your Child Need Immunizations?

The Warren County Health District will be opening up additional appointment times for immunizations April 10 – April 14. This would be a great time for families to schedule kindergarten immunizations and/or the required immunizations for 7th and 12th grades for the upcoming 2017/2018 school year. To schedule an appointment call 513-695-1468.

Students entering 7th grade will need to have one dose of meningococcal (serogroups A, C, W and Y) vaccine in addition to one dose of the Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis) vaccine.

Students entering 12th grade will need to have a second dose of meningococcal vaccine. The second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday. If the first dose of meningococcal vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required.





