Improved Lighting Saves Money for Kings

The Kings District is undergoing a new lighting project. New LED lightbulbs are being installed in all of our school buildings. This project will provide multiple benefits to the district such as increasing the quality of lighting in our classrooms and ease of changing lightbulbs at the building level, decreasing the need to get an electrician to the building.



The biggest benefit to the district is a cost savings of \$24,000 a year in energy and light-bulb costs, after the initial 8.35 month payback period. The new lightbulbs are projected to last 5,000 hours.

The project will take one to two weeks per building and will take place in the evening so there is no disruption of classroom activities.



Did You Know?

The Kings Board of Education voted to place a 6.2 mill Operating Levy on the November 8, 2016 ballot. Each week until the election we will be giving

The 6.2 mill levy will cost \$217 per \$100,000 of property market value, or about \$18 per month.

State Board District 4 Teacher of the Year

We are PROUD to announce that Columbia Intermediate Gifted Teacher, Holly Mueller has been named 2017 Teacher of the Year for State Board of Education District 4. Each year, the Ohio Department of Education invites all local school superintendents to nominate a candidate for Ohio Teacher of the Year. One candidate is chosen from each of the nine State Board districts.

Following an in-depth nomination process, the winners were named this week by Ohio State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Paolo DeMaria. "Teachers are Ohio's most important educational asset and are key to helping our students reach their full potential,"

DeMaria said. "The Ohio Teacher of the Year program calls attention to the good work our educators do every day and highlights schools that are creating the conditions teachers need to be successful."

State Board of Education member, Pat Bruns worked with the local superintendents during the nomination process. She states, "Ms. Mueller's dedication to her students, professional leadership, and accomplishments are most impressive," Bruns said. "She is an exceptional role model."

Kings Superintendent, Tim Ackermann said, "Holly is known as an extraordinary teacher who challenges and excites her students in their learning. I was impressed when she and a colleague, who were inspired by the book A Long Walk to Water by Linda Sue Park, developed a social action lesson for their students. The 'Walk for Water' event they planned raised \$30,000 to bring safe water to South Sudan."

This fall, the state superintendent will announce the Ohio Teacher of the Year, who is selected from the pool of State Board district winners. The Ohio Teacher of the Year will represent our state in the national Teacher of the Year competition sponsored by the Council of Chief State School Officers in 2017. The 7th grade students on the Blue Team at Kings Junior High enjoyed a morning of team building and bonding on Wednesday, August 24. The students and staff spent the morning in Kings Stadium participating in bonding activities to help to get to know one another better.



21st Century Classroom Comes to Kings

If you have been around Kings Junior High School recently, you may have noticed that a couple of the classrooms look a little different. This school year, two 8th grade math classrooms at Kings Junior High have been transformed into "21st Century Classrooms." This new concept focuses on promoting creativity, critical thinking, communication, and collaboration. Additionally, this type of classroom is student centered; the students are learning by doing.

Over the summer, both classrooms were transformed with white boards, new technology, carpet, and moving desks and chairs.

Mr. Erik Poggi and Mrs. Jenna Jackson are teaching in these new classrooms. They state that the students seem much more engaged in learning than in a traditional classroom. Mr. Poggi said, "Kids actually enjoy coming to math class!"



At Kings, we are using this as an innovative teaching pilot to infuse 21st century skills and project based learning. The new furniture provides an avenue to facilitate this learning style. We will be looking at expanding the high school media center's space in the near future.

The cost of this project was funded by permanent improvement funds which pays for items that will last 5 years or longer. Read more about this classroom of the future in a story written by KHS Knight Times Reporter, Madison Lunsford.

Benchmark Building Literacy for Life.

New Elementary Literacy Program

This school year our elementary students will be using a new English Language Arts program. This K-4 program is a research-based comprehensive literacy program.

This program, Benchmark Education, uses a balanced literacy approach to meet the needs of all learners.

A balanced literacy program is designed to incorporate the strongest elements of both phonics and whole language to guide students toward proficient and lifelong reading. The five components of balanced literacy are: read-aloud, guided reading, shared reading, independent reading, and word study. All of the K-4 teachers have been trained and they will continue to receive implementation support throughout the school year.

From the Office of the Superintendent...

Hello Kings Community.

Welcome back to school! It's going to be another exciting year for the Kings School District. We are growing! We have welcomed over 200 new students to our district this year. We are excited about the eleven new developments being built within our district. Our enrollment is now over 4,300 with our biggest class, our kindergarten class, at 385!

I am excited to report that we have introduced a new K-4 balanced literacy program called Benchmark Literacy, which we are using to strengthen our elementary literacy and instructional practices. Additionally, we have rolled out a new PBIS (Positive Behavioral Support) program and RTI (Response to Intervention) program, both focus on ensuring that ALL children have access to high quality instruction and interventions matched to student need.

Our Kings Junior High is participating in a pilot program where we have transformed two of our 8th grade math classes into "21st Century Learning" classrooms. The classrooms have new innovative furniture and technology which will facilitate 21st century skills and project based learning. We are thrilled about bringing new innovative learning to the district for our students.

Our Board of Education approved to place a 6.2 mill Operating Levy on the November 8, 2016 ballot. The district has seen an increase in expenses while experiencing stagnant state funding and a loss of Tangible Personal Property Tax (TPP) contribution. While we have implemented \$500,000 of efficiencies in the last school year, and \$530,000 in efficiencies this school year, our five-year forecast projections show a positive cash balance only through fiscal year 2018. By law, the district cannot operate with a negative cash balance.

We are always looking for ways to grow the district as we strive for excellence year after year. We will continue to research best practices, as well as keeping an eye on district finances and make fiscally responsible decisions. It takes constant effort to maintain quality and I am committed to doing whatever it takes to maintain that for our students!

KHS Students Named to Area Youth Orchestras

Congratulations to our Kings Orchestra and Band students who have been selected as members of the 2016-2017 Cincinnati Symphony Youth Orchestra (CSYO), Northern Cincinnati Youth Orchestra (NCYO), or Dayton Philharmonic Youth Orchestra (DPYO). These talented musicians represent over 30 high schools in Southwestern Ohio, Southeastern Indiana, and Northern Kentucky.

Auditions for the organizations are held one time per year. Students who are selected are required to attend weekly rehearsals.

KHS received 2016 ACT test scores this week. The district achieved a Composite score of 24.6 while the state average score is 22.0. The scores in all categories fall at least 2 points above the state average scores. KHS scores are as high as they have been in the last five years. We are testing more students while maintaining scores.

This year all juniors will be taking a state funded ACT or SAT exam. Our Curriculum Department and high school leadership team are still looking at data to decide which exam will be the best to administer. The exam will be taken in the Spring. Additionally, on October 19, all 10th graders

will be taking a pre-ACT test and 11th graders will take the PSAT.

ODE Wants Feedback on ESSA Survey

The Ohio Department of Education is using an online survey to solicit feedback on its implementation of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The ESSA, which replaced the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) law, is an education policy to ensure all students are successful. By this fall, Ohio must submit implementation plans for approval to get federal funding under this newly enacted policy.

The ODE is asking for input as they develop a state plan for applying the law here in Ohio. The survey covers focus areas of ESSA including accountability, school improvement, educator quality, and student supports, according to the department. We hope you will take the time to give your feedback. This is a pivotal time for Ohioans who care about local control to make their voices heard! 
