There is a new club at Kings High School! Formerly known as the Diversity Club, C.A.R.E., which stands for Culture, Acceptance, Recognition, Ethnicity has been formed to embrace the diversity at KHS.

The goal of the club is to spread awareness and ensure ALL Kings students be global citizens. During last week's meeting, with over 30 students in attendance,



the club read aloud their Mission Statement: Increase Awareness, Step Toward Acceptance, and Achieve Equality. Students spoke of being proud of who they are, that they are looking for acceptance, and hoping to educate others about equality and being sensitive to those who may feel differently than themselves.

Some of the goals of the club are to allow students to discuss changes that they would like to see made, as well as share positive or negative experiences they have at school. The club will also help to promote awareness of minority groups. The students will be working in the coming months to plan events surrounding the mission of their club.

In 2002, the minority student population at Kings High School was 2.9%. It has now grown to 12.2% The C.A.R.E. Club is not just open to minority students, but for any student who may feel different because of cultural or religious differences.

The club's adviser's are Dustin Goldie and Wendy Loudermilk. "We have an amazing group of students who are very involved. They have provided a great amount of support thus far and have had wonderful ideas and input. It is fantastic watching them interact," said Loudermilk. Other staff members assisting with the club are Elisa King, Jorge Gonzalez, Junior Ili, and Katie Mosure.

The group is hoping to get their message out to the Kings Community. Mr. Goldie said, "Since we are a new group, we are hoping to get community members to reach out and help with resources and ideas." Goldie also noted that the students have been a driving force behind the club. "It's almost magical how well all the students work together."

From the Office of the Superintendent...

Dear Parents,

Yesterday, President Obama signed the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). This bipartisan legislation replaced the No Child Left Behind Act which passed in 2002. This new legislation will give individual states more control in educating our elementary and secondary students. It reaffirms the importance of local governance.

While the No Child Left Behind Act gave Washington significant control over states, the ESSA will allow states the flexibility to adopt their own standards and assessments, and create their own accountability systems with the input of education stakeholders. With this in place, schools will be evaluated on a wider range of factors, giving school leaders the opportunity to highlight positive elements of their schools not represented in test scores.

Schools will still be required to administer annual testing in grades 3 through 8 and once in high school in each subject, but with the new law, states will be allowed to use a number of factors on top of testing to assess student performance, and the details of how they test and interpret scores will be up to them. The new law also prohibits the federal government from mandating teacher evaluations or defining what an "effective" teacher is and allows for decisions to be made locally by collaboration between educators, parents, and other community members. U.S. Secretary of Education, Arne Duncan believes in actively empowering state education leaders saying "the best ideas come from outside Washington."

The ESSA, which will take effect on August 1, 2016, will give our state legislature a decisive role in determining how it is implemented. The state will now need to work with local stakeholders and districts to design new assessments and accountability systems. Please continue to talk to your legislators about the importance of local control in education.

We will keep you up-to-date on the latest information as it pertains to our district.


It's Not Too Late!


