Start With Hello Week

"Start With Hello Week" is a program designed by The Sandy Hook Promise and teaches children the importance of connecting to others. We know that young children who are isolated can become victims of bullying, violence, or depression. The "Start With Hello" program asks students, educators, parents and other community leaders who interact with children to take steps in class, the lunchroom and/or other times in their day to be inclusive and connected. Throughout the week students have had various discussions and activities designed to stress the importance of looking out for kids who are alone and what they can do to connect with others.

At SLE, the students started the week out with School Counselor, Mrs. Burdine reading the *The Empty Pot*. It was a great way to start discussions on how to include other people into our daily lives. Students also learned how to say hello in the seven languages spoken at SLE, they made locker signs for students in other classrooms, played Human Bingo at recess, and made Valentine Cards for high school students.

At KME, they started the week with an assembly presented by KME Counselor, Mrs. Perdrix and Sandy Hook Promise Consultant, Alexandra Intorcio from Miami University. Students partici-

pated activities such as BINGO, Mix it Up Lunch, and a scavenger hunt.

In Case of Emergency....

As our Kings Community knows, we use School Messenger as our emergency call system. In light of the recent bomb threats to our district this week, we would like to remind you how the system works.



We received a lot of feedback at the beginning of the year that our community would like for us to use the all-call system for emergencies only. We have been working through our policy and will try, going forward to be sure that you will only receive calls in the event of an emergency. We will, however, continue to utilize the email function for other correspondence.

Please be sure to check your child's School Messenger account for accuracy, as well as making sure that all of the email addresses and phone numbers of the contacts you would want notified in case of an emergency are entered. You will also want to be sure that you have checked the "school hours emergency" and "non-school hours emergency" boxes to receive those calls and emails. If you would like to receive general emails such as newsletters and EBBN, the "general" tab must be checked.

Each student in the district receives a School Messenger account with an activation code at the beginning of the school year. If you are having trouble accessing your account, you may need a new activation code. Your child's building secretary can help you with that.




