KHS Architecture Students Learn about Custom Home Building

Mike Williams, founder and owner of High Pointe Custom Homes, and Ron Globke, a custom home designer with Sensible Home Design, spoke to Mrs. Guilfoyle's Architecture class this week at Kings High School. The Architecture class just finished their Dream House Project and were looking to Mr. Williams for feedback and to answer any questions the students had about the residential building process.

Williams and Globke discussed how the design process typically works from the initial meeting through the phases of building a custom home. They brought a portfolio of work that include homes in Longcove in Mason and Riversbend in South Lebanon. Mike is currently selling custom home building lots in his new development, Highlands at Heritage Hill in the Kings School District. Mike explained that getting your foot in the door early and working for construction companies, finding internships, and making networking connections is his best advice if students want to become a custom home builder. He also stressed the importance of taking business classes if you want to manage your own residential building company. Mike and his family reside in the Kings School District.

The student's next project is called the "KHS Renovation Project" where students will design proposals to house the district's future growth.

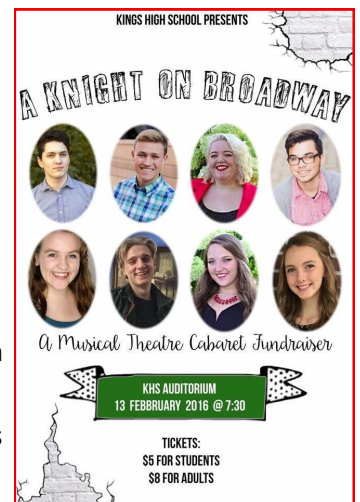
The Fun Way to Learn About Economics at SLE

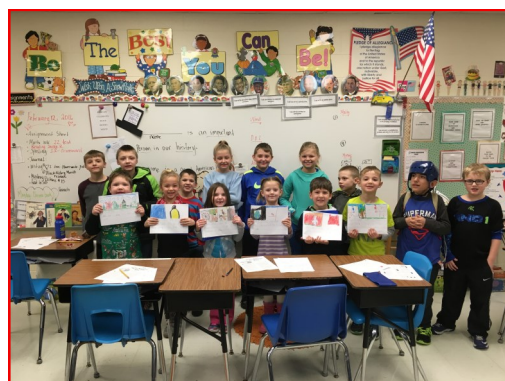


Chinese New Year Celebration at KME

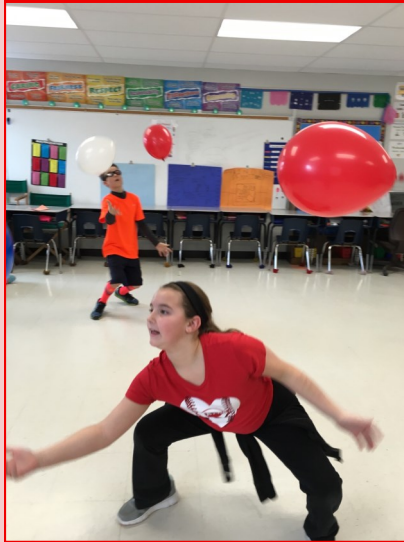

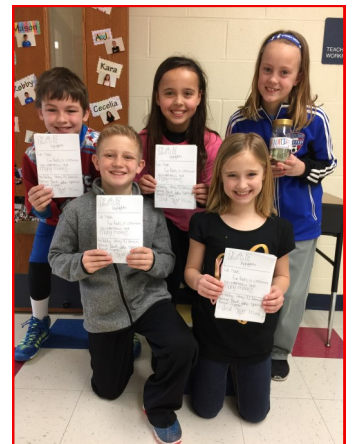

Kings Kindergarten Registration Date Set

Kindergarten Registration for the 2016-17 school year will be held from Monday, February 29 through March 18, 2016 in the Kings Education Center, located at 1797 King Avenue. This year, registration is by appointment **ONLY** and will take approximately 15 minutes. To enter kindergarten for the 2016-2017 school year, your child must turn 5-years old on or before Sept. 30, 2016.

We will continue our Young 5 Program, an optional program for students who turn 5 between July 1 and September 30. Children who enroll in this program will be required to attend full day kindergarten the following year. This program is tailored for children that are chronologically young and typically have not had a preschool experience.

Parents may pick up a 2016-2017 kindergarten packet from any of our elementary buildings or at our Central Registration Office. Forms are also available on our website under enrollment. New Immunization Requirements for 7 & 12 Grade

Beginning next school year, there are new immunization requirements for schools in Ohio regarding the meningococcal vaccine. The state will require incoming 7th graders to have one dose of meningococcal vaccine in addition to the requirement of one dose of Tdap vaccine.

Students entering 12th grade will need to have a second dose of meningococcal vaccine. The second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday. If the first dose of meningococcal vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required.

Meningococcal vaccines help prevent against the bacteria that cause meningococcal disease.
