Kings Students Compete at Cyclocross Competition

Siblings Lucas (KHS Freshman) and Lexi Stierwalt (CIS 6th grade) along with Jacob Krynock (KHS Sophomore), recently completed at the USA Cycling

Cyclocross Nationals Race in Hartford, Connecticut.

Cyclocross is a form of bicycle racing that parallels with mountain bike racing and cross -country cycling. Races typically take place in the winter and consist of many laps featuring pavement, wooded trails, grass, steep hills, and obstacles. What makes this sport unique is that riders must typically carry their bike over the obstacles.







Both boys competed in the 15/16 boys division for the local Lionhearts Junior Development team. Lucas finished 14th and Jacob 23rd out of 73 riders! Lexi

competed in the girls 11/12 division and finished in 8th place, even after having a mechanical issue! They raced during a blizzard with snow and ice falling as they rode.

Kindergarten registration for the 2017-2018 school year will begin on January 23 and run through February 10, 2017. Registration will take place by **APPOINTMENT ONLY**. Please click on our <u>electronic scheduler</u> to choose a convenient time. Morning, afternoon, and evening appointments are available. Appointments will take approximately 15 minutes.

In order to register, please bring your completed <u>kindergarten registration packet</u> along with Original Birth Certificate or Passport, Custody or Court Papers (if applicable), Photo ID of the Parent/Guardian, Immunization Records, Proof of district residency, such as a Rental

or Lease Agreement, Deed, or Settlement Statement. The Parent's/Guardian's name MUST appear on the legal proof of residency document. If the documents are in any other name than the child's parent's/guardian's name that individual must be present and provide a photo ID.

J.F. Burns Elementary School – May 12th at 9:30 am

South Lebanon Elementary School – May 9th at 9:30 am

Kings Mills Elementary School – May 12th at 10:00 am

SLE PTO Hosts New Families


