#### KHS Media Center Getting a New Look

The Kings Local School District is thrilled to announce that Kings High School's Bradford Media Center will be transformed into a large 21st Century Learning Commons for use by our high school and junior high. The proposed opening of the new center will be at the start of the 2017-2018 school year.



Inside, the new Media Center will offer spaces for small and large breakout groups and areas for student collaboration with comfortable seating. All breakout rooms will be equipped with wall-size whiteboards and technology, as well as flexible seating and tables, which will allow students and staff to collaborate on projects. There will be bookshelves placed around the center that will house a collection of the most popular books, as well as access to our online catalog of digital titles.

The new Media Center has been designed by VSWC Architects in Mason, Ohio. The project will be paid for with Permanent Improvement Funds. The PI Fund money covers items that will last 5 years or longer such as furniture, technology, and books.

"We are excited to bring a space to our students and staff that allows them to collaborate and problem solve in a comfortable environment. The Kings School District wants to give our staff and students the tools they need to be competitive in the workforce and college when the graduate," said Kings Superintendent, Tim Ackermann.

#### 2017-2018 Kindergarten Registration



Kindergarten registration for the 2017-2018 school year will begin on January 23 and run through February 10, 2017. Registration will take place by **APPOINTMENT ONLY**. Please click on our <u>electronic scheduler</u> to choose a convenient time. Morning, afternoon, and evening appointments are available. Appointments will take approximately 15 minutes.

In order to register, please bring your completed <u>kindergarten registration packet</u> along with Original Birth Certificate or Passport, Custody or Court Papers (if applicable), Photo ID of the

Parent/Guardian, Immunization Records, Proof of district residency, such as a Rental or Lease Agreement, Deed, or Settlement Statement. The Parent's/Guardian's name MUST appear on the legal proof of residency document. If the documents are in any other name than the child's parent's/guardian's name that individual must be present and provide a photo ID.


Mark your calendars as each elementary school will hold a kindergarten tour day:

#### **Intervention Specialist Teaches Awareness**

Intervention Specialist, Suzanne Dwyer presented her Circles Awareness Program to all of the 7th grade students this week at Kings Junior High School. Over time, she has compiled a presentation for students to recognize how we are all the same, no matter what our color, religion, race, or even disability. She has used this approach in many other districts and some have even made it part of their "guidance curriculum."

Although the program increases awareness about disability to some extent, not much scientific information is given. General Education students learn to take a perspective through their "circles" of what life would be like if they had one very different from the one they have now. Dwyer speaks of her experiences with her beloved brother, Jim who has special needs. She encouraged the students to reach out to the students at KJH with multiple disabilities. She also invited the students to be a part of the Best Buddies Club, a club that meets on Tuesday's after school that brings together students with disabilities with typical peers. The club is hosting a Winter Ice Breaker event on Tuesday, January 24 from 5:00-7:00 p.m. at KJH.

Last Friday, January13, KJH hosted another Walk of Fame, a special event to highlight and recognize different athletic, artistic, and academic groups at KJH. The Walk of Fame is a part of Kings Junior High School's PACT (Pride, Attitude, Commitment, Together) Program.

#### KHS Community Service Club Looking for Help




#### A Knight to Remember: How Lucky Can You Be?
