District Enrollment Plan Update

The district has been working on a new Enrollment Plan to accommodate the anticipated future growth and overcrowding in our buildings.

Kings Superintendent, Tim Ackermann has put together a proposal that he will present to the Kings Board of Education at the February 16, 2016 meeting. The new proposal is to keep the current school building configuration, but re-draw our elementary boundary lines. The proposed lines will make Socialville-Fosters Road the new district cut off between Kings Mills Elementary and J.F. Burns Elementary.

If Mr. Ackermann's proposal is accepted by the Board next month, we will quickly communicate with those students/families directly affected by the change. We know this will be a big transition for our families so our Transition Plan includes a May 2016 Open House at J.F. Burns Elementary to welcome new students.

Kings' New Business Manager



The Kings Local School District has hired a new Manager of Business Affairs. Chris Brown, current Superintendent at the Southwest Local School District will begin his position at Kings on June 1, 2016. The Kings Board of Education approved a 2 year, 225-day contract.

Mr. Brown will replace the retiring, Mr. Steve Waldmann. Brown has led the Southwest Schools as Superintendent since 2008. He has

extensive knowledge of school business operations, as he has held the additional role of Business Manager there since 2012. He will oversee the Kings Business Office, including the annual budget, grants, purchasing, maintenance, transportation, safety and security, and food service. Superintendent Tim Ackermann said, "Chris has the experience and qualifications needed to lead our Business Office. He will be a great addition to our team."

Kings Theatre Program Names Scholarship After Kaylyn Daumeyer

The Kings Stagelighters, an organization that supports Kings Theatre, began a scholarship program in 2014 to honor a graduating senior that participates in the theatre program while at Kings. Recently, the Daumeyer Family donated \$3,000 to the Kings Theatre Program in memory of their daughter, Kaylyn.

The Stagelighters have named the scholarship The Kaylyn Daumeyer Kings Theatre Scholarship. Kaylyn, a Kings incoming 8th grader, died tragically last August. Her parents related that Kaylyn was a part of the Junior High Musical and loved it. She was looking forward to being a part of the performing arts programs at Kings; Theater, Dance, and Band. The Daumeyer Family did some fundraising through a GoFundMe Page and a memorial golf outing in the fall.

The Daumeyer's presented a check to Mark Abbott, President of Stage-lighters, at last week's matinee of the Little Mermaid, Jr. The Stagelighters organization said, "The gift is so welcome and unexpected!" The recipient of the Kaylyn Daumeyer Kings Theatre Scholarship is determined by what they have gained from the program and what they have, in turn, given back. Abbott said, "While Kaylyn's presence will be missed at Kings Theater, her memory and spirit will be with us through her heroism."


KJH Helping Flint with a Water Drive

Three KHS Students Earn Top Scores on American Legion Test



Three Kings High School Students came out on top after taking the annual American Legion Americanism and Government Test. Seniors Zach Douglas and Claire Middlekamp, and junior Brendan Guerin earned high scores on this optional test administered last fall. They were recognized for winning at the Post, as well as the County level.

Every year, Kings High School participates in the American Legion Post 194 Americanism and Government Test. The test program was created by Legionnaires in 1936. The test consists of 50 questions and a 300 word essay. The test is designed to test an individual student's knowledge about

our United States Flag, Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and State, County, Township, Village, and School District Government. This past year, KHS tested close to 600 students in grades 10-12. The students were presented certificates and cash prizes this week from 1st Vice Commander Jim Jennings from American Legion Post 194 in Mason.

The Young Republican Club will meet every-other week and all students, regardless of their political ideology, are welcome to attend.


2016-2017 Kings Preschool Registration Has Begun





Kings Coach Named to Miami Middletown Athletic Hall of Fame

Congratulations to Kings High School Girls Varsity Basketball Coach, Matt Knott for being inducted into the 2016 Miami University Middletown ThunderHawk Hall of Fame. The HOF is designed to pay tribute and honor those athletes, coaches, teams, and others who have brought recognition and honor to the University.

Mr. Knott was a four year member of the men's basketball team. He was selected 1st team All-ORCC '96-97 and 2nd team All-ORCC in '98-99. He helped lead his team to an ORC State Championship in '95 and ORCC Championships in '94-95 and '95-96. Matt received the Lynn Darbyshire Warrior Award in 1995. During his career, he averaged 11.67 PPG and totaled 1,214 points. He scored a career high 36 points



vs. OSU Newark in '97. Matt was an impressive 226/282 for 80% from the free throw line while sinking 150 3 -pointers during his 104 game career.

Matt earned a Bachelor of Science in Zoology and a Master of Arts in Teaching from Miami University. He teaches 8th grade science at Kings Junior High School.

Criteria for selection include achievements while at the Middletown Campus as well as accomplishments beyond the college years in athletics, chosen career and civically. There were three total inductees into the 2016 class. Congratulations Matt!


