Nearly 200 children are signed up to participate in this year's Kings Kids Summer Camp Program. Kings High School Partners with Living Word Fellowship for AP Testing

With a record number of students taking College Board Advanced Placement (AP) tests this year, around 400 students taking 800 exams, Kings High School was faced with a challenge in finding a testing location that was both quiet and large enough to hold enough tables and chairs to meet College Board's guidelines. After many calls to facilities throughout the area, Living Word Fellowship, 9781 Fields Ertel Road, provided the solution needed, at no cost to the district. During

the two weeks of testing, hundreds of students occupied their walls from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. most days.

With the focus on hospitality and serving the community, the staff graciously welcomed students, kept the facility clean and quiet, and accommodated our staff by storing tables and chairs, as well as meeting them in early hours to allow for set up and test preparation. MAP Training

School may be out but some of our teaching staff have been attending training for MAP (Measures of Academic Progress).

MAP is a type of Mathematics and Reading assessment that is computer adaptive. This assessment will be used in the district next year for K-8. The assessments are designed to help teach-



ers determine a student's instructional level and provide context for determining where each student is performing in relation to state standards. MAP will also measure student growth over time.

Kings Elementary Curriculum Director said, "We are very excited about implementing MAP next year. The data from the MAP assessments will help teachers meet the needs of all students, including those with more intense instructional needs. MAP assessments will play an integral part of the district's RTI process by providing data that will allow teachers to provide high-quality instruction and interventions matched to individual student needs."

The Warren County Combined Health District Immunization clinic will be holding a special clinic on Saturday, June 11 from 8:30 a.m. – noon. They will be offering all required vaccines and any recommended vaccines for children in Kindergarten, 7th grade and 12th grade. Children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. A copy of a current shot record is required as well as any insurance cards.

Immunizations will be given by appointment only. Please call 513-695-1468 or 513-695-1229 to schedule an appointment for the June 11 clinic.

Just a Reminder....

Beginning next school year, there are new immunization requirements for schools in Ohio regarding the meningococcal vaccine. The state will require incoming 7th graders to have one dose of meningococcal vaccine in addition to the requirement of one dose of Tdap vaccine.

Students entering 12th grade will need to have a second dose of meningococcal vaccine. The second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday. If the first dose of meningococcal vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required.



Meningococcal vaccines help prevent against the bacteria that cause meningococcal disease.




