#### KHS Students Art on Display Locally

Seven Kings High School Digital Media Art students have been selected to represent KHS in this year's Artist Reaching Classrooms (ARC) Art Exhibition. Congratulations to Jenna Cooper, Carter Favorite, Bella Spleen, Faith Shields, Lauren Goslee, Kali Reaves, and Andrew Nishimori.



The ARC Exhibition opens to the

public at the Cincinnati and Hamilton County Public Library on April 12. The students' submissions will be juried and students will be honored at the ARC Reception on Wednesday, April 26.

There are twelve schools participating in this year's exhibition. One student from each school will be honored. Students will compete within their school for a \$200 gift card and a People's Choice Award winner will also receive a \$200 gift card. Additionally, awards will be given for Best Artist Statement and three top awards selected from the entire ARC Exhibit.

ARC immerses high school art students in Cincinnati's visual arts community and exposes them to careers in the arts. Professional artists visit classrooms to talk with the students about both the creative and practical aspects of a career in art. The students also visit an artist's studio, such as a painter's atelier, glassworks or printing press and they visit the Taft Museum of Art. Students are expected to complete a research project on an object from the Museum's collection, describing its history and significance, and explaining why the artwork has personal appeal.

Finally, the program culminates in a professionally organized exhibition of selected students' artwork.

## Teachers Bring Eco-Schools Program to SLE

South Lebanon Elementary teachers, Juli Elder, Stephanie Riggsby, Abby Burroughs, and Amanda Wey, recently met with members of the National Wildlife Federation Eco-Schools program. This program strives to support education for sustainability and integrates "learning and action through the three interconnected elements of sustainability - social equity, environmental health and economic prosperity."

During this two day training, Jennifer Dowd, the K-12 Education Manager from NWF guided teachers while deciding on a goal and a vision statement. They discussed how to implement this goal including action steps, they prac-



ticed completing an environmental audit, toured school grounds, and met with Karen and Lisa from McCluskey Chevrolet to explore how a partnership will be beneficial.

SLE's vision statement is "Everyone working together to support student opportunities to learn outdoors in order to encourage growth mindsets, kinder, happier, caring and creative children. We intend to create life long learning, environmental stewards by giving them opportunities now to care for and connect with their school and world."

"The goal of bringing this program to the school is to increase the number of minutes students spend outdoors learning about and investigating their habitat," said Third Grade Teacher, Amanda Wey. These teachers will start this project, tracking the number of minutes spent outside learning until spring break. After spring break, other teachers will be invited to also track their minutes. Once the steps have been implemented, the school can receive different awards through the Eco-Schools USA program.

Long term goals for this project include clearing out the outside learning space, making paths, and adding additional tools (including lesson plans for each grade level) to enhance outdoor learning experiences.

#### KHS Students Compete in Rotary Contest

Two Kings High School students participated in the Mason-Deerfield Rotary's Four Way Test Speech Contest this week.

The Four-Way Test Speech Contest, sponsored by Rotary International, is held annually for interested high school students at local and district levels. The speech is presented from memory without the aid of a podium, notes, displays or props, and lasts between four and six minutes. Contestants apply the Four-Way Test which asks the following four



things: Is it the TRUTH?, Is it Fair to all concerned, Will it build GOOD WILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS, and Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Each year, two students from Kings High School and two from Mason High School participate in the Mason-Deerfield Rotary contest. This year Savannah Mussari and Austin Roberts represented Kings.




## American Red Cross Offers Free Smoke Detectors


