CIS was recently notified that it was the winner of the Iron Giraffe Super Challenge, which means it was the first school in the world to raise at least \$25,000 in the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 school years! The prize of the Iron Giraffe Super Challenge is a personal visit from Salva Dut! CIS and its sixth graders are committed to helping transform lives in South Sudan by bringing clean water to villages there.

Salva Dut resides in South Sudan and only comes to the United States 2-3 times a year. The Kings Community is so fortunate to be able to hear from Salva Dut in person.

American Mathematics Competition

Congratulations to Kings High School Junior Anders Wikum and Freshman Peter Morris who are the winners for KHS in this year's American Mathematics Competition in the AMC-12 and AMC-10 Division, respectively.

This year, members of the KHS Math Team took the AMC 10 (for 9th and 10th graders) and AMC-12 (for 11th and 12th graders). The AMC-10 is a 25-question, 75-minute, multiple choice examination in secondary school mathematics containing problems which can be understood and solved

with algebra and geometry concepts. The AMC-12 is a 25-question, 75-minute, multiple choice examination in secondary school mathematics containing problems which can be understood and solved with pre-calculus concepts.

For more than 60 years, students across the country have taken up the challenge of America's longest-running and most prestigious math contests, The American Mathematics Competitions (AMC). Every year, at thousands of schools in every state, more than 350,000 students are presented with a set of questions rich in content, designed to make them think and sure to leave them talking. A special purpose of the AMC-10/12 is to help identify those few students with truly exceptional mathematics talent.



Kings Offers Support for Parents with Special Needs

An informational meeting was held at Kings High School for families of students with disabilities on Thursday, March 10. The focus of the event was to allow parents to learn about various options for their child as they move towards adulthood. Representatives from Warren County Developmental Disabilities (WCDD) and Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) provided information to parents on the referral process, how eligibility is determined, and what services are available.



Parents also had the opportunity to listen to two individuals currently utilizing services with WCDD. Ohio law requires that school districts address the transition needs of students with disabilities as they move onto more education or into the workplace. This was the first of it's kind here at Kings, and the feedback was positive. The district's goal is to provide as much information to the families to support them in making future decisions.



Future Business Leaders of America

Kings High School Junior Brendan Guerin and Sophomore Spencer Kinkelaar attended the 69th Annual Ohio Future Business Leaders of America State Leadership Conference in Columbus, Ohio on March 7 and 8. There were over 50 competitive events to participate in and Brendan and Spencer entered a combined total of twenty-seven events and placed in the top ten finishers in twenty-six of those twenty-seven! In addition, Spencer was elected to serve as the 2016-17 state of Ohio Vice President of the Southern Region.

There were 380 students and 17 high schools from across Ohio in attendance at the Ohio State University.

Kings Kindergarten Registration Date Set

Kindergarten Registration for the 2016-17 school year will be held until March 18, 2016 in the Kings Education Center, located at 1797 King Avenue. This year, registration is by appointment **ONLY** and will take approximately 15 minutes. To enter kindergarten for the 2016-2017 school year, your child must turn 5-years old on or before Sept. 30, 2016.

We will continue our Young 5 Program, an optional program for students who turn 5 between July 1 and September 30. Children who enroll in this program will be required to attend full day kindergarten the following year. This program is tailored for children that are chronologically young and typically have not had a preschool experience.

New Immunization Requirements for 7 & 12 Grade

Ohio Senator Cliff Hite introduced and sponsored Senate Bill 121 that would require students in 7th and 12th grade to have the meningitis vaccine. The bill was signed into law by Governor Kasich and will go into effect beginning next school year.

SLE Teacher Earns Digital Innovator Certification




