KHS Mock Trial Team Heads to State

The Kings High School Mock Trial Team will head to the Mock Trial State Competition in Columbus March 10-12. Congratulations to Gabbie Griffen, Chloe Super, Sam Purkiss, Kyle Glennon, Ryan Corey, Brendan Geurin, Dunia Alkurdi, Grace Palaprtty, Ben Jackson, and Kyle Ward. This is the first time a Kings Mock Trial Team has won a chance to compete in the State Competition.



Each Ohio Mock Trial team consists of five to eleven students who assume the roles of witnesses and attorneys to present to both sides of an original case based on a constitutional issue. Each team will compete in two trials against opposing teams. The goal of the competition is to encourage students to develop critical thinking and communication skills and to foster a better understanding of the American legal system. Each team has students participate as attorneys, witnesses, and a bailiff.

This year, 21 students participated on the KHS team to form two teams. During the District competition, Kings competed against 13 other teams from across Butler and Warren Counties and was one of only three teams to advance to Regionals. At Regionals, Kings competed against 15 teams from Clermont, Montgomery, Hamilton, and Warren counties. KHS students Sam Purkiss and Grace Palaparty won best witness awards and Ryan Corey won best Attorney at Regionals.

The team is led by KHS Government teacher, Elisa King. This year Mrs. King has had great assistance by KHS English teacher, Jonathan Bitzer. Additionally, the team's Attorney Adviser is 2004 KHS graduate, Sarah Theodore Soule They have also been supported this year by the Kircher Law Firm and Frost, Brown, and Todd Attorneys.

The State Competition requires overnight stays in Columbus, transportation, and meals. The team has asked members of our business community to help with donations. If anyone is interested in helping to defray student's costs at State, please contact Lisa King at eking@kingslocal.net. Good luck!

Social Media Security



Stephen Smith, Director of Educational Leadership for Cincinnati Bell Technology Systems spoke to the students at Kings Junior High this week on protecting themselves when using social media. He also held a parent information session in the evening.

He offered many great tips for the students and parents. He says it's ok to monitor your child's cell phone. He warns, "Don't buy your child a smartphone unless you are willing to supervise the phone." He also explained that it's important to keep phones updated to pre-

vent phones from being jail broken.

Smith also made parents aware of some of the more dangerous apps available such as Yik Yak, AskFm, and Whisper. Many of these sites are used for cyberbullying. He also noted that parents should think about technology-free zones in their homes. Many teens text and use their phones while they should be sleeping.

"Kids think what they are doing online is private. Make sure applications are locked down to private and friends only," he said. "Make your kids aware of their digital footprint."

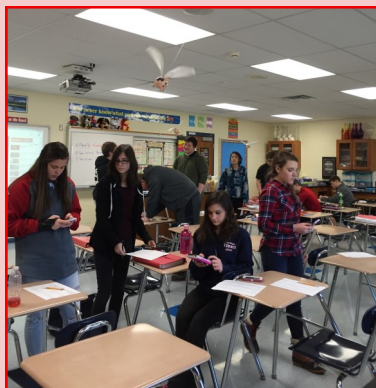

Finally, in her interview, Sophia told Nicole that she was thankful for everyone who signed her petition and said, "Just remember, Be Nice Out There!"

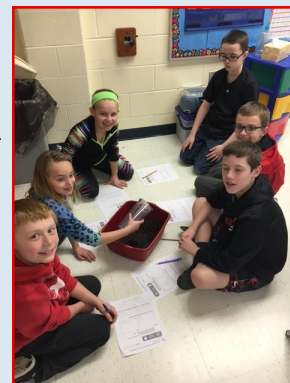
Do Pigs Fly?

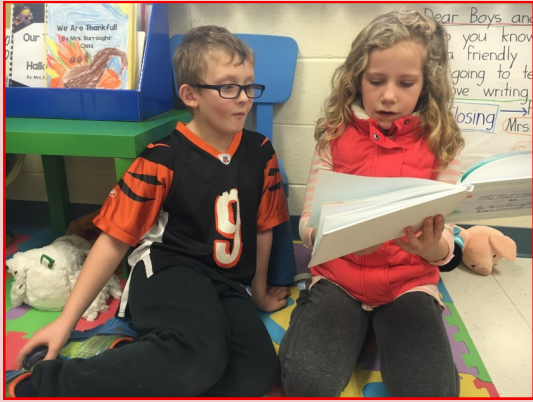

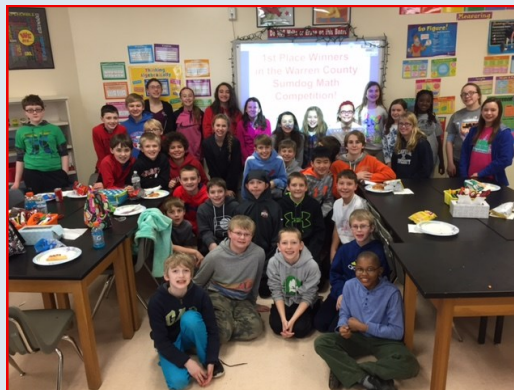
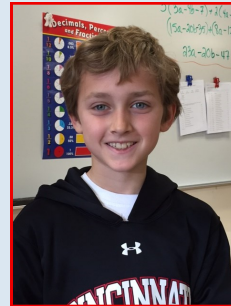
CIS Place in the Warren County Sumdog Online Math Competition

The 5th and 6th grade advanced math classes at Columbia Intermediate recently participated in the Warren County Sumdog Online Math Competition. The students were challenged to solve 1000 problems, most of which were above grade level problems.

The students had 7 days to complete this challenge. Six students were in the top ten out of 760 students in the county that entered. 5th grader Ethan Streckfuss (pictured left) won 1st place answering 988 problems correct and 6th grade William Lee (right) was a very close 2nd answering 987 correct.

The 6th grade class won 1st place overall scoring 613 and the 5th grade class won 2nd place scoring 456. Lynn Wagner, Math Gifted Intervention Specialist said, "I am so proud of all their hard work!"

A special shout out to South Lebanon Elementary's "Murphy Math NY" group who placed 3rd with a score of 428!

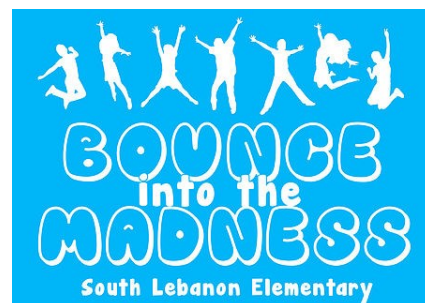

This year, registration is by appointment **ONLY** and will take approximately 15 minutes. To enter kindergarten for the 2016-2017 school year, your child must turn 5-years old on or before Sept. 30, 2016.

Children who enroll in this program will be required to attend full day kindergarten the following year. This program is tailored for children that are chronologically young and typically have not had a preschool experience.

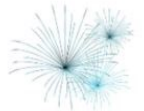

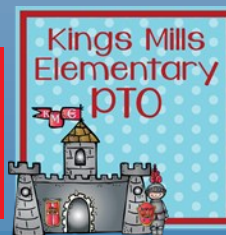
