Kings voters approved a 6.2 mill operating levy on Tuesday, November 8. The levy which will cost taxpayers \$217 for every \$100,000 of home value, passed by a 56 to 44 percent margin. Kings Superintendent, Tim Ackermann said, "We would like to thank our Kings Communi-



ty who took the time to vote in this critical election. I am humbled and don't take for granted the impact this levy has on your pocketbook."

The levy will generate \$4.6 million dollars and will allow the district to operate in the black for at least the next three years. Ackermann said, "We don't take asking taxpayers for additional funds lightly. We will continue to be fiscally responsible and with their money, as cost savings measures are a part of an ongoing effort."

The last increase for operations was approved by voters in 2010. Through diligent cost savings efforts, the district was able to make that last a total of 6 years, three years beyond the original forecast. The Kings School Board is committed to making this new levy last for three years. "We will continue to build our relationship with the community and realize that the issue of school funding is very complex. We are also talking to our legislators regarding school funding and how we can secure additional revenues without having to ask our taxpayers. With the passage of this operating levy, we are looking to continue to provide our students with an excellent education," said the superintendent.

A levy leadership team of 15 has been working for weeks to organize the campaign to spread the district's message. An additional over 100 community volunteers helped by going door to door, speaking with property owners, and working the polls. Kings Levy Chairperson, Lysa Knight said that the success of the levy passing was a group effort. "It was amazing to see all of the volunteers who stepped up to help," said Knight. "We are a destination district because of the people who live and work here. I am proud to call this community home. We are ALL Kings Strong! To all the volunteers and the 7,640 voters who led us to the W~ thank you!"

#ReadWalkWater

Columbia Intermediate School held their 4th annual #ReadWalkWater event on Friday, November 4. The walk is a way to bring awareness of the need for clean drinking water in South Sudan. This is the 4th year for the walk.

The walk is inspired by the book, *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park. All sixth grade students read the book and also Skyped with the Water for South Sudan, Inc. staff in New York City.

The 6th graders raised \$2,157 so far, almost halfway toward their goal of \$5,000, the amount needed to be part sponsor of a well in South Sudan. A source of clean water transforms a village by making it possible to build schools, medical centers, and markets. Sixth graders also donated 227 gallon jugs of water to Matthew 25 Ministries. In the past three years, CIS has raised over \$37,000 for Water for South Sudan and will be sponsors of three wells by the end of the year.




