Kings Local School District

Dear Parents,

The Kings Local School District has a 6.2 mill operating levy on Tuesday's ballot. An operating levy is used to fund operating and maintenance expenses for the district.

Why do we need a levy?

- The State of Ohio eliminated the Tangible Personal Property Tax reimbursement provided to many school districts. At the end of the TPP phase out, Kings will lose over \$4 million in funding.
- Kings has seen a flat increase in state funding since 2010 and we are expecting that trend to continue over the next 5 years. (While many other districts around the state are realizing increases in funding).
 - The district receives \$3,516 per pupil. The state average funding per pupil is \$5,756; 64% more than Kings.
 - Kings is receiving below average state funding producing above average performing students.
- Kings has realized a 5.5% increase in enrollment growth this school year alone. This year's enrollment growth cost the district an additional \$270,000.

Other levy facts:

- ✓ The district has implemented cost saving measures of over \$1 million dollars since FY '16.
- Kings hasn't asked for new funds since 2010. Through diligent cost savings efforts, the district was able to make the previous levy last three years longer than promised.
 - Pay freezes for employees for 2 of the 5 last years
 - Re-negotiated transportation contract
 - Energy Savings
 - Moved all employees to a High Deductible Health Insurance Plan
 - 6.2 mills was decided upon by the Board of Education based on the district's five-year forecast to guarantee the levy lasts three years, assuming the state funding model remains as forecasted.
 - The levy will cost a taxpayer \$217 per year, per \$100,000 of property market value, or about \$18/month. If the November operating levy fails and the Board votes to run another 6.2 mill levy in 2017, the district will need to make \$1.5 million in additional reductions in personnel and services.

Kings Assistant Superintendent Reads at SLE




Support Kings Local Food Pantry




