#### **ODE Performs Independent Audit at Kings**

The Ohio Department of Education was in the Kings District on October 10 to conduct an independent financial analysis of the Kings five-year

forecast. Kings Treasurer, Shaun Bevan requested the review of the forecast to verify his results.

Representatives from the School Funding and Fiscal Support Services Office of the ODE completed a four year history and a projection for the current and next fiscal year. Prior to their visit, the Kings Treasurer's Office sent them several documents and reports requested to complete the analysis. Those documents included district expenditures and balances, estimated resources, a list of operating levies with voted millage, four year's of historical financial data, most recently adopted appropriation resolution, most recent foundation funding report, current adopted salary schedules for personnel, and adopted budget for the next fiscal year.

We are happy to report that the results of ODE's audit supports and validates Kings five-year forecast as presented by Mr. Bevan. Superintendent, Tim Ackermann said, "The recent independent review of our five-year forecast by the Ohio Department of Education supports and validates the negative cash balance projected for the near future, as presented by Kings Treasurer, Shaun Bevan. By law, a school district cannot operate with a negative cash balance, thus causing the need for additional funding."

#### Two National Honor Society Inductions This Week at KHS

This week, Kings High School inducted 106 students into two different National Honor Societies. The KHS NHS inducted 48 juniors and 10 seniors in a candle lighting ceremony on Tuesday, October 25. The new members were "tapped" earlier in the month by current NHS officers and presented with a rose.

The four pillars set forth by the NHS are Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. Students must maintain a GPA of 3.75 and submit an application for entry. KHS NHS members will represent the school by completing service projects during the school year.

On Wednesday, October 26, the inaugural Kings High School Spanish National Honor Society induction took place. Led by KHS Spanish Teachers, Lindsay Six and





Valerie Eldridge, they inducted 48 juniors and seniors. To be inducted, students must have maintained an overall GPA of 3.5 and a GPA of 3.5 specifically among Spanish classes. They had to be enrolled in a level 3 class or higher and receive a teacher recommendation.

Six said, "The National Society has existed since 1953 and Kings has had chapters in the past, but after a period without a chapter here at Kings, this is our inaugural class of inductees into the newly formed Lazarillo de Tormes chapter."

Inductees will be completing various service projects around the school this year and committing to pursue the learning of the Spanish language.

The Knights beat the Tigers 35-14 and took home the Rumble for the Ribbon trophy.


