#### **Festo Visits Kings**



As a part of Mason's Bicentennial, the City of Mason and the Economic Development Department hosted Mason Innovation Week this week. They partnered with Festo, the new German-based company located on Columbia Road, which specializes in automation technology.

This week long event invited leaders in the technology industry, the Mason community, and students from Mason and Kings to come together to revel in the technological innovations developed and those yet to come. As a part of this week, they hosted Mason Innovation Night. This special event demonstrated how unique public-private partnerships can advance community education and promote science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) programming.

As a part of the night, Kings and Mason third graders witnessed a dramatic presentation of Festo's flying robotic bird and dragonfly in the Mason High School Large Commons. They also had the opportunity to explore hands-on STEM stations in the Fieldhouse - including water bots from Sinclair College, UC Engineering Robots and activities by Mason Schools organizations/classes. Our Kings Engineering Academy, Digital Media Arts and Art Departments exhibited that evening, as well.

On Wednesday, October 28, Festo brought their presentation to Kings High School and gave our 7-11 grade students the opportunity to see their presentation and learn about the mechanics behind Festo's automation and power robotics. Students witnessed the flight of both Festo's robotic bird and dragonfly. Pilots for these robots were flown all the way from Germany.

#### **Update of JFB Monarch Butterflies**

The latest update is that butterflies have been sighted (by citizen scientists) crossing the border into Mexico. J.F. Burns Elementary Students have tagged 150 Monarchs this year with the Mother Nature's Classroom Program. They actually ran out of tags because it was such a successful season! Mrs. Russell from Mother Nature's Classroom said, "Next year I will order more and we will see if we can beat our own record!"

Russell has been in touch with the tagging organization, Monarch Watch, to see how we will know if any of our tagged but-



terflies have been spotted. What she learned is that we will receive an email in the Spring if we were lucky enough to have one make it and be found. Students in Mexico are paid \$5 for each tagged butterfly that they find, so there are citizen scientists at work there as well. Monarch Watch also publishes a comprehensive list in the spring for the previous season's data.

#### Pumpkin Fun in SLE Kindergarten

Their pumpkin weighted 15 pounds and had 500 seeds! Mrs. Mellendorf said, "We had a fun afternoon."

Luckily, the Madagascar orphanages that have teamed up with Memory Project are quality places where children can grow and thrive and are full of dedicated caretakers.




