Math Winners at CIS

The students in Lynn Wagner's Advanced Math classes at Columbia Intermediate School recently entered a U.S. National Math Contest, sponsored by a website called Sumdog.

There were a total of 19,188 students out of 848 classes participating from the U.S. Mrs. Wagner had 2 students score in the Top 50 Students overall category; Sixth grader William Lee placed 28th and Fifth grader Matthew Hruska placed 45th.

Overall, the 6th graders placed 4th in the daily competition and came in 64th place and the 5th graders placed 6oth overall. Mrs. Wagner said, "I am extremely proud of all that my students accomplished in this contest!"

Sumdog uses educational games to motivate students in Common Core Math Standards. It is an adaptive learning engine which monitors and guides students as they work on solving the math problems online which allows teachers access to reports on their progress. Wagner said, "Many of my students were solving math questions that were one to two grade levels above their current grade."

The conductors of the Ensemble said that they were so impressed by the preparation and high level of the auditions.



Kings High School Work Study Program

Transition planning is critical to the success of our students at Kings High School. Students in grades 9-12 who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) receive an education that is designed to meet their unique needs through special education or related services to prepare them for further education, employment, and independent living. Ohio law requires that school districts address the transition needs of students with disabilities as they move onto more education or into the workplace. Teams are made up of the student, their family, teachers and outside agencies to develop an appropriate plan for each student.

A main focus for Kings High School is providing an opportunity for our students to take part in the Work Study Program, which assists students in developing employability skills and setting them up for a successful transition from school to work. Participants in this program can earn credit through their experience towards graduation from high school. Our Work Study program not only focuses on encouraging our students to be self-supporting and productive, it also encompasses ideas around attendance, character, appearance, attitude, productivity, organizational skills, communication, cooperation, respect and teamwork. Each of these skills are critical to our students upon their graduation and being successful outside of the high school setting. Currently, our high school is working with Amanda Pennix, Transition Coordinator through Warren County Educational Service Center, with whom we've developed opportunities within our school district and in the community. At this time, we have students that are involved with inschool work experiences such as: Kings High School Cafeteria, Kings High School Athletic Department, Kings High School Main Office, Kings Local Schools Maintenance and Grounds, and the Kings Education Center.

Kings High School is also committed to provide students with opportunities that allow for interaction in the community setting. These experiences will help improve social skills, behaviors, and attitudes for our students with disabilities. In addition to in school work experiences, we also have students working at Hope Church in Mason, Countryside YMCA, and Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities.

The Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities is working closely with districts within the county and has placed a Transition Coordinator, Lori Yearout, in the high school to allow students, parents and teachers to discuss transition services for students who may qualify for services outside of the school day.

The goal of the program is to provide experience to our students in a safe environment where they can display what they are capable of, in addition to developing new skills to prepare them for the real world. While they are learning many different responsibilities on a daily basis, the end result is invaluable. Our hope is to provide students the opportunity to gain lifelong skills that will support gainful employment.

Health Heroes Flu Vaccination Clinic for Students - October 20, 2015

For the health of all of our students, staff, and your family we encourage you to obtain a flu vaccination for your child and your family through your healthcare provider or pediatrician.

As a convenience for families and to also reach students who may not otherwise receive immunization against the flu, we will be offering flu vaccination clinics on Tuesday, October 20, 2015 at all 6 of our school buildings.



Health Heroes, Inc. will be offering nasal FluMist vaccine for our students with no deductibles or out of pocket expenses. Private insurance companies and Medicaid will be billed. Students with no insurance will be provided their flu vaccine at no cost.

The Health Heroes Clinic is strictly voluntary. No student will receive a vaccine unless a written completed consent form is returned to school. Consent forms will be sent home with students in the near future.

If you prefer the injectable (IIV) flu vaccine for your child, please contact the building nurse to obtain a green IIV consent form.


