National Merit Scholarship Program Semifinalists Named

The Kings Local School District is proud to announce that Kings High School Senior, Drew Dailey has been chosen as Semifinalist in the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Program.

About 1.6 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools entered the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2016 PSAT, which served as an initial screen of program entrants.



The nationwide pool of Semifinalists includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state. The number of Semifinalists in a state is

proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors. Drew is among the approximately 16,000 semifinalists in the 63rd annual scholarship program.

In February 2018, the Semifinalists will be notified whether they have advanced to the Finalist standing. The finalists will have the opportunity to then compete for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million that will be offered next Spring.

KHS Principal, Doug Leist said, "This is a tremendous accomplishment for Drew. Again, we are reminded that our Kings students, teachers, and programs are prepared to excel and can compete among the nation's elite. We look forward to following Drew's academic career!"

Drew is the son of Laura and Lyle Dailey. Although he is undecided on where he will be attending college, his future plans include studying Mechanical Engineering. Currently, Drew is taking Credit College Plus courses at the University of Cincinnati.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is a prestigious academic competition for recognition and scholarship that began in 1955. The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test serves as an initial screen of more than 1.5 million entrants each year.

ODE State Report Card and Kings Quality Profile Released

The Ohio Department of Education yesterday released its <u>2016-2017 report card</u> results for the state's school districts. The report card data was collected from state-mandated testing that Ohio students completed last spring.

The ODE uses the data to create six grade card components: Achievement, Gap Closing, K-3 Literacy, Progress, Graduation Rate, and Prepared for Success.

The State Report Card contains demographic details and results of state tests. While test results are important, those results do not fully depict what distinguishes this district as one of the highest performing districts in the State of Ohio.

Kings' overall Achievement grade is a "C" this year. The overall component grade is made up of the district's achievement grade and its performance index. While we believe that there is some value in the report card data, we do not believe that the state report card represents the accomplishments and successes that take place on a daily basis in our school district.

For this round of testing, the state increased its benchmarks by as much as 14 percentage points in some areas, making a true apples-to-apples, year-to-year comparison difficult.

Many of the Annual Measurable Objectives for the district increased, although the letter grade stayed the same. However, we are happy to report that the K-3 Literacy grade improved to a "B" from a "C."

Superintendent, Tim Ackermann said that the report card grades do not reflect the outstanding practices that are happening in our classrooms.


"The state report card is an ineffective tool to measure the education that we provide to our students," he said. "We are providing the resources for our students to create relationships, foster creativity, and be innovative. We are educating the whole child, not teaching them to be a good test taker."

For the 5th year, Kings Local Schools joined more than 85 districts throughout Ohio in releasing a Quality Profile, a comprehensive, community-oriented companion to the state's Local Report Card. The profile includes additional accountability measures that better define a high-quality education and are not included in the state's report card.

We hope that our community finds this report helpful as they measure the quality of education that our school district brings to the community.

She will represent one of over 30 junior high and high schools in southwestern Ohio, southeastern Indiana, and northern Kentucky.



CIS Receives Grant for Makerspace

Columbia Intermediate School Media Specialist, Kelly McKiernan was recently awarded a 2016 Learning Links grant. She submitted the grant to the Greater Cincinnati Foundation Learning Links program in May.

Her grant was focused on supporting the new CIS Makerspace. The grant will be used to purchase materials and resources for the media center's Makerspace and the new 5th grade ITime class. Sensory Motor Stops at JFB

Research shows that students are better able to focus and attend when they are given adequate amounts of movement every day. To give students more opportunities for this, Lisa Moore, Occupational Therapist, and Crystal Robinson, Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant, created sensory motor stops throughout the hallways of J.F. Burns Elementary.



Identified by a green star, these stops allow children to build core strength and complete activities to support focus and attention. For example, the sensory stop inside the recess entrance door contains a variety of cool down and calming exercises to allow students time to reset before they go back to the classrooms.

There are also stops placed near busy restroom areas and in the cafeteria hallway, where waiting in line is enhanced with tailored activities.

KHS STAAC Welcomes West Clermont to the ECC




The Kings High School Student Athlete Advisory


