Congratulations to KHS National Merit Semifinalists

The Kings Local School District is proud to announce that 2 students from Kings High School have been chosen as Semifinalists in the 2017 National Merit Scholarship Program. Congratulations to Kings Seniors

Hannah Rasmussen and Anders Wikum.

These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,400 National



Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million that will be offered next Spring. Less than one percent of high school seniors nationally will go on to compete for the prestigious National Merit Scholarships.

Hannah is the daughter of Kent and Bonnie Rasmussen. She has a current GPA of 4.59 and aspires to study science in college. She is currently taking an AP Physics C class via Northwestern University and just last weekend, broke a school record in Cross Country!

Anders parents are Erick and Elizabeth Wikum. He has a current GPA of 4.558 and taking a full load of AP courses his senior year. Anders is looking at MIT and Stanford for college and was just named KHS Math Team Co-Captain.

KHS Principal Doug Leist said, "This is a tremendous accomplishment for our students. It is yet another reminder to our community that Kings students, teachers, and programs are prepared to excel and can compete among the nation's elite. We look forward to following the academic careers of Hannah and Anders. Their futures are incredibly bright."

About 1.5 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools entered the 2017 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2016 PSAT, which served as an initial screen of program entrants. The number of Semifinalists in a state is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors. National Merit Scholarship winners of 2017 will be announced in four nationwide news releases beginning in April and concluding in July.

ODE State Report Card and Kings Quality Profile Released

On Thursday, September 15, the Ohio Department of Education released Kings 2015-2016 Report Card. This year's report card includes letter grades in six categories such as achievement, progress, gap closing, graduation rate, K-3 literacy, and prepared for success.

"Overall, the Kings district is continuing to improve with this year's results. As a district, we still have areas to improve, but are always looking for ways to enhance our instructional practices to meet the needs of all students." said Tim Ackermann, Kings Superintendent.

The State Report Card contains demographic details and results of state tests. While test results are important, those results do not fully depict what distinguishes this district as one of the highest performing districts in the State of Ohio. This year's report card has been met with some complaints from local and state leaders. "You can't compare the achievement measure to last year (and) people shouldn't jump to conclusions," State Schools Superintendent, Paolo DeMaria said. "A child's learning is more than what is tested. We shouldn't let report cards define us but at the same time these report cards should inform us. A take away from this is, we still have more work to do."

The Kings Local School District is joining other area districts in voicing concern over the state testing requirements. Superintendent Tim Ackermann said, "Federal mandated testing has reduced classroom instruction time. Our hope is to gain more local control by asking our state legislators to reduce testing requirements."

Kings Local Schools joined approximately 70 school districts throughout Ohio in releasing a Quality Profile, a comprehensive, community-oriented companion to the state's Local Report Card. The profile includes additional accountability measures that better define a high quality education and are not included in the state's report card.

View Kings Local School District 2015-2016 Quality Profile.

The Quality Profile helps characterize the overall educational value of public education beyond standardized testing. The content is based on six categories: academics, arts, fiscal stewardship, parent and community involvement, student leadership and activities, and student services.

Participating districts initially surveyed residents to determine factors they value in their child's education that are not being measured by the state, resulting in a more comprehensive profile that measures those education components that the community considers most important.

Kings Local Schools Among Top for Return on Investment for Homebuyers

The <u>Cincinnati Business Courier released a report</u> this week that ranks Greater Cincinnati school district's for their property values and return on investment.

In a new ranking by RE/Max of Southern Ohio, Kings was ranked #2. The ranking was created based on home sale prices in communities served by the top public high schools in the area according to U.S. News & World Report. The report states that Kings has an average home sale price of \$248,949. Sale prices have increased by 8% from a year ago.



"Choosing a home near a well-rated school is almost always a good investment," said Jeanette Schneider, senior vice president, RE/MAX of Southern Ohio. "Given the limited housing inventory throughout Cincinnati, finding the perfect home near a high-ranked school may be a challenge. These homes will sell fast, especially if they are well priced. Buyers need to be prepared to act quickly when the right home hits the market."

Kings High School was recently ranked by U.S. News & World Report as a Best High School for 2016. KHS ranked #460 out of more than 28,000 high schools in the nation, earning them a spot in the top 3% in the country. Additionally, KHS is ranked #15 in the state of Ohio and the #1 high school in Warren County.

Kings' student enrollment has grown almost 6% this school year? That growth requires additional resources such as staff members, technology, furniture, and curriculum materials. This year's enrollment growth cost the district an additional \$270,000. Projections show that enrollment will grow 23% by 2020.


KHS Day of Service

Health Heroes Flu Vaccination Clinic for Students - October 20, 2016

For the health of all of our students, staff, and your family we encourage you to obtain a flu vaccination for your child and your family through your healthcare provider or pediatrician.

As a convenience for families and to also reach students who may not otherwise receive immunization against the flu, we will be offering flu vaccination clinics on Thursday, October 20, 2016 at each school during school hours.



Health Heroes, Inc. will be offering flu shots for our students with no deductibles or out of pocket expenses. Private insurance companies and Medicaid will be billed. Students with no insurance will be provided their flu vaccine at no cost. Nasal FluMist is not available this year based on CDC recommendations.

The Health Heroes Clinic is strictly voluntary. No student will receive a vaccine unless a written completed <u>consent</u> form is returned to school by October 14.


