#### Kings Releases Quality Profile

Kings Local Schools joined more than 60 school districts throughout Ohio in releasing a Quality Profile, a comprehensive, community-oriented companion to the state's Local Report Card. The profile includes additional accountability measures that better define a high quality education and are not included in the state's report card.

#### View Kings Local School District 2015 Quality Profile.

The Quality Profile helps characterize the overall educational value of public education beyond


standardized testing. The content is based on six categories: academics, arts, fiscal stew-

ardship, parent and community involvement, student leadership and activities, and student services.

Participating districts initially surveyed residents to determine factors they value in their child's education that are not being measured by the state, resulting in a more comprehensive profile that measures those education components that the community considers most important.

Now in its third year of development and being released statewide for the second time, the Quality Profile is sponsored by the Alliance for High Quality Education, a statewide education consortium that works to improve educational opportunities for students and to represent member districts on matters of educational policy and funding.

We hope that our community finds this report helpful as they measure the quality of education that our school district brings to the community.

#### Kings PowerPack Program Beginning Soon

There are children in the Kings School District who rely on resources such as free or reduced-price school lunches during the week. The Kings PowerPack Program is designed to meet the needs of hungry children at times when other resources may not be available. Last year the program served 246 children by placing a bag of weekend food discreetly in their backpacks on Friday mornings. That's over 39,000 meals provided to

kids in the Kings community last year! Each PowerPack bag contains items that are carefully selected so that a child can self-prepare their meal.

The bags are packed each week on Thursdays by Kings High School and Kings Junior High students. The program is 100% volunteer led and operated so all proceeds go directly to the purchase and distribution of food.

The Kings PowerPack Program was founded by Joshua's Place Community Outreach Ministry and partially funded through partnerships with The Wesley Watkins Memorial Foundation, Shared Harvest Food Bank and private donations. Tonight our 3-o Knights take on undefeated Turpin in ECC action at the Castle. Kick-off is 7:00 p.m. See you there!




#### **Homecoming Parade**
