The National Merit Scholarship Program has released their list of Commended Scholars for 2016. Eight of those students are Kings High School Seniors! Commended students are named on the basis of

a national Selection Index qualifying score, applicable to all participants without regard to state-by-state distribution. More than 1.5 million students entered the 2016 competition by taking the 2014 PSAT.

The qualifying score for this level may vary from year to year, but it's within the 96th percentile of college-bound juniors who take the PSAT/NMSQT. Although Commended Students are honored for their academic promise, they do not continue in the competition for Merit Scholarship awards. Some, however, may be candidates for special scholarships offered by corporate sponsors. Congratulations!

Bus Safety at SLE




year! Each PowerPack bag contains items that are carefully selected so that a child can self-prepare their meal.
