

#### 2018 National Merit Commended Scholars

The National Merit Scholarship Program has released their list of Commended Scholars for 2018. Four of those students are Kings High School Seniors! Congratulations to Shannon Jelley, Spencer Kinkelaar, John Naughton, and Tyler Roetenberger.

More than 1.6 million students entered the 2018 competition by taking the 2016 Prelim-



inary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT). National Merit identified the 50,000 high scorers and is recognizing their exceptional academic promise by designating them Commended Students. Commended students are named on the basis of a national Selection Index qualifying score of 211, applicable to all participants without regard to state-by-state distribution. The qualifying score for this level may vary from year to year, but it's within the 96th percentile of college-bound juniors who take the PSAT/NMSQT.

A spokesperson for National Merit commented, "These young men and women being named Commended Students have demonstrated outstanding potential for academic success. These students represent a valuable national resource; recognizing their accomplishments, as well as the key role their schools play in their academic development, is vital to the advancement of educational excellence in our nation. We hope that this recognition will help broaden their educational opportunities and encourage them as they continue their pursuit of academic success."

Although Commended Students are honored for their academic promise, they do not continue in the competition for Merit Scholarship awards. Some, however, may be candidates for special scholarships offered by corporate sponsors. Congratulations!

#### KHS Student Lands Perfect ACT!

Kings High School is proud to announce our first perfect ACT in many years from senior, Drew Dailey.

In March, Ohio students could take the college entrance exam for free as part of new testing requirements from the state.

Drew scored his perfect 36 on his third attempt, although he hit 34 on the other two tries! Heidi Murray, Drew's Academic Counselor said, "I have never seen a 36 in my 17 years here." Ohio's average ACT score for the graduating class of 2017 was 22. The national average is 21. On average, less than one-tenth of 1 percent of students who take the ACT gets a perfect score of 36.



Drew was recently named as a Semifinalist in the National Merit Scholarship Program. He was recognized at halftime of last week's football game as a KHS Academic Achiever.

Drew is most proud of his accomplishments in cross country, quiz team, and being named a National Merit Semifinalist. He plans to attend Cooper Union College to study Mechanical Engineering.

# **PBIS Experience at SLE**

As part of the district's Positive Behavior Interventions Supports (PBIS) program, the staff at South Lebanon Elementary came up with a fun way to share their talents with their students. They wanted to expose their students to a variety of experiences to enrich their little worlds. The "25 EXPERIENCES" is a program that will occur every 15 school days. The students are grouped heterogeneously with 21 students from all grade levels at each experience.

Each grade level creates a goal for each 15 day cycle to work on with their students. There are also two other goals for the entire building. This includes 80% homework completion and no bus or office referrals.

There are many talented teachers at SLE. With their first

EXPERIENCE, they exposed ALL children to either square dancing, clogging, juggling, yoga, creating crafts like dream catchers, yarn art, and Shrinky Dinks. Students "traveled" to the farm, Bengals stadium, Hawaii, and Ireland with beautiful pictures and music on Promethean boards. The staff exposed them to vintage games, soccer, speed stacking, chop sticks, and fancy drawing. They also showed them fossil rocks, monarch conservation, agricultural fun, circuit boards, and marshmallow designs. In addition, students had the opportunity to visit goal setting rooms and read aloud stories.

At the end of each EXPERIENCE, a school-wide drawing takes place highlighting the character trait of the month. The winners of the drawing receive a Spirit Stick. The next EXPERIENCE will take place October 12. Intervention Specialist, Kelly Cefalu said, "Each student is working hard to achieve their goals."

#### Free and Reduced Lunch Opportunity

The Kings Food Service Department is a member of the National School Lunch Program. With this program, they offer a Free and Reduced Meal Program.



Free and Reduced-price lunches are available to students who qualify and meet the eligibility guidelines. Students who qualified last school year automatically qualify

for the first 30 days of the school year. However, a new application must be completed for the 2017-2018 school year within 30 days from the start of the school year for the child to continue the program.

In order to continue the program past Monday, October 2 for those currently on the program, the application is due **TODAY**, September 29. 
needed to be a finished edge. The only restriction was that his or her original continuous line drawing had to remain a part of the final design.


