The ESSA, which replaced the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) law, is an education policy to ensure all students are successful. By this fall, Ohio must submit implementation plans for approval to get federal funding under this newly enacted policy.

The ODE is asking for input as they develop a state plan for applying the law here in Ohio. The survey covers focus areas of ESSA including accountability, school improvement, educator quality, and student supports, according to the department. 


Homecoming Parade
